(b) Vehicles designed and used for the transportation of 15 or fewer persons, including the 10 driver, except that the operator of a vehicle described in this paragraph is not required to: 11 12 (A) Be properly secured with a safety belt or safety harness as required by ORS 811.210 if the 13operator is a taxicab operator; or (B) Ensure that a passenger is properly secured with a child safety system as described in ORS 14 811.210 (2)(a), (b) or (c). 15(2) Any vehicle not required to be equipped with safety belts or safety harnesses at the time the 16 17 vehicle was manufactured, unless safety belts or safety harnesses have been installed in the vehicle. (3) Any vehicle exempted by ORS 815.080 from requirements to be equipped upon sale with 18 19 safety belts or safety harnesses. 20 (4) Any person for whom a certificate is issued by the Department of Transportation under ORS 811.220. 21[(5) Any person who is a passenger in a vehicle if all seating positions in the vehicle are occupied 2223by other persons.] 24 [(6)] (5) Any person who is being transported while in the custody of a police officer or any law 25enforcement agency. 26 [(7)] (6) Any person who is delivering newspapers or mail in the regular course of work. 27[(8)] (7) Any person who is riding in an ambulance for the purpose of administering medical aid 28 to another person in the ambulance, if being secured by a safety belt or safety harness would substantially inhibit the administration of medical aid. 2930 [(9)] (8) Any person who is reading utility meters in the regular course of work.
