

Senate Bill 511

Sponsored by Senator THATCHER

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs Department of Transportation to conduct study of data collection methods relating to driving while under influence of intoxicants and to report findings to Legislative Assembly.
Sunsets January 2, 2017.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to collection of data regarding offense of driving while under the influence of intoxicants.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. (1) The Department of Transportation shall conduct a study of data collection methods relating to driving while under the influence of intoxicants and make a report of its findings. The report must include:

(a) Information about how to collaborate with other public bodies, as defined in ORS 174.109, to collect data on the following:

(A) The recidivism rate of driving while under the influence of intoxicants in this state;

(B) The effect that participation in an alcohol and drug treatment program has on the recidivism rate; and

(C) The types of alcohol and drug treatment programs that are the most effective at reducing the recidivism rate of driving while under the influence of intoxicants in this state; and

(b) Recommendations for necessary legislative action to collect data regarding alcohol and drug treatment programs and the effect that the programs have on the recidivism rate of driving while under the influence of intoxicants in this state.

(2) The department shall submit the report required by this section to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to crime in the manner provided in ORS 192.245 no later than September 15, 2016.

SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2015 Act is repealed on January 2, 2017.
