**SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Establishes [*free*] **half-priced** resident uniformed services appreciation hunting [*and angling licenses*] **license** for persons who are [*residents of state and who are*] **resident** members of uniformed services.

[*Declares emergency, effective on passage.*]

2 Relating to resident uniformed services appreciation licenses; creating new provisions; and amending  
3 ORS 497.102.

4 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 497.102 is amended to read:

6 497.102. (1) The State Fish and Wildlife Commission is authorized to issue, upon application, to  
7 persons desiring to hunt wildlife the following licenses and permits and shall charge therefor the  
8 following fees:

9 (a) Resident annual hunting license to hunt wildlife, \$23.50.

10 (b) Nonresident annual hunting license to hunt wildlife, \$134.50.

11 (c) Resident annual juvenile hunting license for persons 12 through 17 years of age to hunt  
12 wildlife, \$11.50.

13 (d) Nonresident annual juvenile hunting license for persons 12 through 17 years of age to hunt  
14 wildlife, \$17.50.

15 (e) Resident pioneer hunting license to hunt wildlife for persons 65 years of age or older who  
16 have resided in the state for not less than 50 years prior to the date of application, free.

17 (f) Resident annual senior citizen hunting license to hunt wildlife for persons 70 years of age  
18 or older who have resided in the state for not less than five years prior to the date of application,  
19 one-half the fee imposed under paragraph (a) of this subsection for a resident annual hunting license  
20 to hunt wildlife.

21 **(g) Resident uniformed services appreciation hunting license to hunt wildlife for a person**  
22 **who is a resident member of the uniformed services, as defined in ORS 497.006, who files with**  
23 **the commission written proof that the person is a resident member of the uniformed ser-**  
24 **vices, one-half the fee imposed under paragraph (a) of this subsection for a resident annual**  
25 **hunting license to hunt wildlife.**

26 [(g)] (h) Resident disabled veteran hunting license to hunt wildlife for a person who files with  
27 the commission written proof that the last official certification of record by the United States De-

1 partment of Veterans Affairs or any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States shows the  
2 person to be at least 25 percent disabled, free.

3 [(h)] (i) Annual resident private hunting preserve permit to hunt privately owned hunting pre-  
4 serve game birds, \$4.

5 [(i)] (j) Annual nonresident private hunting preserve permit to hunt privately owned hunting  
6 preserve game birds, \$10.

7 [(j)] (k) Nonresident hunting license to hunt migratory waterfowl and upland birds for three  
8 consecutive days, \$24.50.

9 (2) The hunting preserve permits referred to in subsection [(1)(h) and (i)] (1)(i) and (j) of this  
10 section are in lieu of the hunting licenses required by the wildlife laws.

11 **SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 497.102 by section 1 of this 2015 Act apply to li-**  
12 **censes applied for on or after the effective date of this 2015 Act for activities occurring on**  
13 **or after January 1, 2016.**
