Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Public Defense Services Commission for certain biennial expenses.

Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by commission.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2015.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 <u>SECTION 1.</u> There are appropriated to the Public Defense Services Commission, for the 6 biennium beginning July 1, 2015, out of the General Fund, the following amounts, for the

7 following purposes:

8 (1) Appellate Division \$ 15,183,755

9 (2) Professional services..... \$253,151,744

10 (3) Contract and Business

Services Division...... \$ 4,043,355

<u>SECTION 2.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Public Defense Services Commission, for the following purposes:

(1) Professional services...... \$ 3,291,980
