

Senate Bill 577

Sponsored by Senator BOQUIST

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Justice for various public safety purposes in support of rural or fiscally distressed counties.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon State Police for troopers in rural or fiscally distressed counties.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to state financial administration; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Department of Justice, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, out of the General Fund, the following amounts for the following purposes in support of rural or fiscally distressed counties:

- (1) **Criminal Justice Division
Operations..... \$ 550,000**
- (2) **Criminal Justice Division
Organized Crime Section \$ 850,000**
- (3) **Criminal Justice Division
Oregon TITAN Fusion Center... \$ 600,000**
- (4) **Criminal Justice Division
Internet Crimes Against
Children Task Force \$ 600,000**
- (5) **Grants to district attorneys,
community corrections and
sheriffs..... \$ 2,800,000**

SECTION 2. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Oregon State Police, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$1,200,000, which may be expended for state troopers in rural or fiscally distressed counties.

SECTION 3. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage.
