SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Authorizes Oregon Health Authority to impose civil penalties on credentialing organizations and health care practitioners who violate laws and rules governing credentialing program administered by authority.

A BILL FOR AN ACT 2 Relating to credentialing of health care practitioners. Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 3 SECTION 1. (1) Sections 2 and 3 of this 2015 Act are added to and made a part of sections 2 to 7, chapter 603, Oregon Laws 2013. 5 (2) Sections 2 to 7, chapter 603, Oregon Laws 2013, are added to and made a part of ORS 6 7 chapter 441. 8 SECTION 2. (1) In addition to any other liability or penalty provided by law, the Oregon Health Authority may impose a civil penalty on a credentialing organization or a health care 9 practitioner for violating a provision of sections 2 to 7, chapter 603, Oregon Laws 2013, or a 10 rule adopted under sections 2 to 7, chapter 603, Oregon Laws 2013. 11 (2) In consultation with the advisory work group convened under section 7, chapter 603, 12 Oregon Laws 2013, the authority shall adopt a schedule establishing civil penalties that may 13 be imposed under this section. However, the civil penalty may not exceed: 14 ___ per violation for credentialing organizations; and 15 (b) \$____ per violation for health care practitioners. 16 SECTION 3. The Oregon Health Authority shall deposit all moneys collected by the au-17 thority under sections 2 to 7, chapter 603, Oregon Laws 2013, in the Oregon Health Authority 18 19 Fund established under ORS 413.101. Moneys deposited in the fund under this section are continuously appropriated to the authority for the purpose of carrying out the duties, func-20 tions and powers of the authority under sections 2 to 7, chapter 603, Oregon Laws 2013. 21 22
