SUMMARY

Directs Secretary of State to conduct general review of adoption of cross-nomination system for candidates for public office in Oregon.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Α	BILL	FOR	AN	ACT

- 2 Relating to elections; and declaring an emergency.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - SECTION 1. (1) The Secretary of State shall conduct a general review of the adoption of a cross-nomination system for candidates for public office in Oregon. The review must include a study of the fiscal impact of implementing the system. The secretary may assess similar laws in other states.
 - (2) The secretary shall submit a report on the conclusions of the review described in subsection (1) of this section to the interim legislative committees on rules not later than September 15, 2015.
 - SECTION 2. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage.
