Senate Bill 679

Sponsored by Senator BATES

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Creates Medicaid Management Information System Oversight Committee to monitor progress of improvements to Oregon's mechanized claim processing system for Medicaid claims. Specifies membership and powers.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to Oregon Health Authority information systems; and declaring an emergency.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section, "Medicaid Management Information System" or "MMIS" means the mechanized claims processing and information retrieval system for the medical assistance program that is funded, in part, under 42 U.S.C. 1396b(a)(3).
 - (2) The Medicaid Management Information System Oversight Committee is created to monitor the progress of the Oregon Health Authority in implementing improvements to the MMIS. The committee consists of:
 - (a) The cochairpersons of the Joint Legislative Committee on Information Management and Technology.
 - (b) Three individuals, appointed by the State Chief Information Officer, who have expertise in information technology and are not affiliated with any of the vendors that have information technology or systems contracts with the Oregon Health Authority.
 - (c) The Legislative Fiscal Officer or the officer's designee from the Legislative Fiscal Office.
 - (d) Three individuals, appointed by the Director of the Oregon Health Authority, who each represent a coordinated care organization that serves medical assistance recipients.
 - (3) The cochairpersons of the Joint Legislative Committee on Information Management and Technology shall be the cochairpersons of the MMIS Oversight Committee.
 - (4) The term of a legislative member of the committee shall expire on the date of the convening of the odd-numbered year regular session of the Legislative Assembly next following the commencement of the member's term. The term of all other members shall be four years. Members of the committee may be reappointed. If a vacancy occurs on the committee for any reason during the term of membership, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives or the official who appointed the member to the vacant position shall appoint a new member to serve the remainder of the term. A member of the committee may be removed from the committee at any time by the official who appointed the member.
 - (5) The committee shall meet at such times and places as determined by the

cochairpersons.

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- (6) A majority of the members of the committee constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business.
- (7) Official action by the committee requires the approval of a majority of the members of the committee.
- (8) Legislative members shall be entitled to payment of compensation and expense reimbursement under ORS 171.072, payable from funds appropriated to the Legislative Administration Committee.
- (9) Members of the MMIS Oversight Committee who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are not entitled to compensation, but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary travel and other expenses incurred by them in the performance of their official duties in the manner and amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. Claims for expenses incurred in performing functions of the committee shall be paid out of funds appropriated to the Legislative Administration Committee for purposes of the MMIS Oversight Committee.
- (10) The committee may compel the testimony of witnesses and the production of documents as necessary to carry out its duties.
- (11) Notwithstanding ORS 192.630 and subject to the requirements of ORS 192.660, the committee may meet in executive session solely for the purpose of discussing information protected from disclosure as trade secrets under ORS 192.501.
- (12) The Legislative Fiscal Office shall furnish to the committee such services of personnel and such other facilities as are necessary to enable the committee to carry out its functions.
 - SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2015 Act is repealed on January 2, 2020.
- <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage.
