

## SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 698

- 1 On page 2 of the printed bill, delete lines 2 through 45.
- 2 On page 3, delete lines 1 through 15 and insert:
- 3 **“SECTION 2. (1) The Task Force on School Nursing is established.**
- 4 **“(2) The task force established by this section consists of 14 members appointed as fol-**
- 5 **lows:**
- 6 **“(a) The President of the Senate shall appoint one member from among members of the**
- 7 **Senate.**
- 8 **“(b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint one member from among**
- 9 **members of the House of Representatives.**
- 10 **“(c) The Governor shall appoint 12 members as follows:**
- 11 **“(A) One member who represents education service districts that provide health services.**
- 12 **“(B) One member who represents a school district that primarily serves an urban area.**
- 13 **“(C) One member who represents a school district that primarily serves a rural region.**
- 14 **“(D) One member from the Oregon Health Authority who is involved in school health.**
- 15 **“(E) One member from the Department of Education who is involved in school health.**
- 16 **“(F) One member who is a member of a statewide nonprofit organization that is an as-**
- 17 **sociation organized by and for Oregon school nurses.**
- 18 **“(G) One member who represents a statewide nonprofit organization that is a profes-**
- 19 **sional association for nurses in this state.**
- 20 **“(H) One member who represents classified school employees who work directly with**
- 21 **school nurses.**
- 22 **“(I) One member who represents a statewide nonprofit organization that is dedicated to**
- 23 **developing school-based health centers.**
- 24 **“(J) One member who represents a coordinated care organization that provides health**
- 25 **services in this state.**
- 26 **“(K) One member who represents a private insurer in this state.**
- 27 **“(L) One member who is a local public health official.**
- 28 **“(d) When appointing members under paragraph (c) of this subsection, the Governor**
- 29 **shall consider whether the composition of the task force represents diversity in relation to**
- 30 **race, ethnicity, languages and disability status.**
- 31 **“(3) The task force shall:**
- 32 **“(a) Examine other health care funding sources, including the billing of students’ health**
- 33 **insurance for the costs of school health services provided at school, for the purpose of de-**
- 34 **termining if schools may transition from using moneys received for educational purposes to**
- 35 **using moneys from the other health care funding sources to pay for school health services.**

1       “(b) Recommend sustainable funding sources for school health services that could be  
2 used to fund required school health screenings and to achieve the level of school nursing  
3 services described in ORS 336.201.

4       “(c) Recommend standards of school nursing practices that include outcome measures  
5 related to health transformation and academic performance.

6       “(d) Recommend ways to create a coordinated school health services model and to foster  
7 and promote a noncompetitive strategy that is collaborative and that directs an appropriate  
8 level of funding to school nursing and school-based health centers.

9       “(4) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the trans-  
10 action of business.

11       “(5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the members  
12 of the task force.

13       “(6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.

14       “(7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appoint-  
15 ment to become immediately effective.

16       “(8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson  
17 or of a majority of the members of the task force.

18       “(9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.

19       “(10) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and  
20 may include recommendations for legislation, to an interim committee of the Legislative  
21 Assembly related to education or health care no later than September 15, 2016.

22       “(11) The Department of Education shall coordinate with the Oregon Health Authority  
23 to provide staff support to the task force.

24       “(12) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are  
25 not entitled to compensation, but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary travel and  
26 other expenses incurred by them in the performance of their official duties in the manner  
27 and amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. Claims for expenses incurred in performing func-  
28 tions of the task force shall be paid out of funds appropriated to Department of Education  
29 for purposes of the task force.

30       “(13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist  
31 the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating  
32 to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force  
33 consider necessary to perform their duties.”.

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
