Senate Bill 756

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Modifies offense of smoking in motor vehicle to clarify that offense applies to smoking marijuana and use of electronic cigarette to vaporize cannabinoid solutions.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

1 A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to marijuana; creating new provisions; amending ORS 811.193; and declaring an emergency.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - **SECTION 1.** ORS 811.193 is amended to read:
 - 811.193. (1)(a) A person commits the offense of vaporizing cannabinoids or smoking in a motor vehicle if the person uses an electronic cigarette for the purpose of vaporizing cannabinoid solutions or smokes in a motor vehicle while a person under 18 years of age is in the motor vehicle.
 - (b) As used in this subsection[,]:
 - (A) "Electronic cigarette" means a device that can be used to deliver cannabinoids in the form of a vapor to a person inhaling from the device.
 - (B) "Smokes" means to inhale[,] or exhale[,] a substance contained in, or to burn or carry, a lighted cigarette, cigar, pipe[, weed, plant,] or other product or device used to smoke tobacco, marijuana, a regulated narcotic or other combustible substance.
 - (2) Notwithstanding ORS 810.410, a police officer may enforce this section only if the police officer has already stopped and detained the driver operating the motor vehicle for a separate traffic violation or other offense.
 - (3) Smoking in a motor vehicle is a:
 - (a) Class D traffic violation for a first offense.
 - (b) Class C traffic violation for a second or subsequent offense.
 - SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 811.193 by section 1 of this 2015 Act apply to conduct occurring on or after the effective date of this 2015 Act.
 - SECTION 3. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage.
