

Senate Bill 779

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON VETERANS AND EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires State Department of Fish and Wildlife to study expanding application of laws that consider members of uniformed services residents for licensing purposes and present report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to environment and natural resources on or before September 15, 2016.

Sunset January 2, 2016.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to the State Department of Fish and Wildlife.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. The State Department of Fish and Wildlife shall conduct a study to determine whether ORS 497.006 should be amended to allow additional members of the uniformed services to be considered resident persons for the purpose of purchasing licenses, tags and permits issued by the State Fish and Wildlife Commission. The department shall submit a report with the results of the study, and may include recommendations for legislation, to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to environment and natural resources in the manner provided under ORS 192.245 on or before September 15, 2016.

SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2015 Act is repealed on January 2, 2016.
