## B-Engrossed Senate Bill 78

Ordered by the Senate June 25 Including Senate Amendments dated March 30 and June 25

Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with presession filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President (at the request of Senate Interim Committee on Education and Workforce Development)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Modifies requirements for becoming approved teacher education program.

Establishes Teacher Education Program Accreditation Account to enable Teacher Standards and Practices Commission to award grants to teacher education programs for certain accreditation.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to teacher education; creating new provisions; amending ORS 342.147; and declaring an emergency.
  - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
    - **SECTION 1.** ORS 342.147 is amended to read:
    - 342.147. (1) After considering recommendations of the State Board of Education, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission shall establish by rule standards for approval of teacher education institutions and teacher education programs. [Public teacher education institutions shall be approved for programs of more than four years' duration only if teacher education programs which are reasonably attainable in a four-year period are also available in the system of higher education and are designed to culminate in a baccalaureate degree that qualifies its graduates for entry-level teaching licenses.]
      - (2) The commission shall establish standards for approval that shall include:
    - (a) Requiring a teacher education program to be accredited by a national organization that represents teachers, policymakers and teacher educators and that provides accreditation based on nationally recognized standards and on evidence-based measures; and
    - (b) Approving a public teacher education program of more than four years' duration only if teacher education programs that are reasonably attainable in a four-year period are also available in the system of higher education and are designed to culminate in a baccalaureate degree that qualifies their graduates for entry-level teaching licenses.
    - [(2)] (3) The commission shall establish rules for teacher education institutions and teacher education programs that allow:
    - (a) Teacher education programs leading to graduate degrees to commence prior to the student's completion of baccalaureate degree requirements [and that allow]; and
    - (b) The combined use of undergraduate and graduate level course work in achieving program completion.

**NOTE:** Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter [*italic and bracketed*] is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

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- [(3)] (4) Whenever any teacher education institution or program is denied approved status or has such status withdrawn, [such] the denial or withdrawal must be treated as a contested case within the meaning of ORS chapter 183.
- [(4)] (5) Nothing in this section is intended to grant any authority to the commission relating to granting degrees or establishing degree requirements that are within the authority of the State Board of Higher Education or any of the public universities listed in ORS 352.002, or that are within the authority of the governing board of any private institution of higher education.
- SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 342.147 by section 1 of this 2015 Act become operative on July 1, 2022.
  - SECTION 3. Section 4 of this 2015 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 342.
- SECTION 4. (1) The Teacher Education Program Accreditation Account is established in the State Treasury, separate and distinct from the General Fund. Interest earned by the Teacher Education Program Accreditation Account shall be accredited to the account.
- (2) Moneys in the Teacher Education Program Accreditation Account are continuously appropriated to the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission to award grants to teacher education programs for the purpose of having the programs accredited by the organization described in ORS 342.147 (2)(a), as amended by section 1 of this 2015 Act.
- SECTION 5. (1) The Teacher Education Program Accreditation Account established by section 4 of this 2015 Act is abolished on July 1, 2022.
- (2) Any moneys remaining in the account on July 1, 2022, that are unexpended, unobligated and not subject to any conditions shall be transferred to the General Fund on July 1, 2022.
- SECTION 6. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$200,000, which shall be transferred to the Teacher Education Program Accreditation Account established in section 4 of this 2015 Act.
- SECTION 7. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 1, chapter \_\_\_\_, Oregon Laws 2015 (Enrolled Senate Bill 5538), for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission, is increased by \$83,643 for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of ORS 342.147, as amended by section 1 of this 2015 Act.
- <u>SECTION 8.</u> This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage.
