## Senate Bill 798

Sponsored by Senator FERRIOLI

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Voids agency rules filed with Secretary of State on or after effective date of Act and before January 1, 2016.

Provides that final rule filed with Secretary of State on or after effective date of Act that is based on proposed rule for which rulemaking notice was given before effective date of Act is void and of no effect.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to rule moratorium; and declaring an emergency.
- Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2015 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 183.325 to 183.410.
  - SECTION 2. (1) An agency may not file a rule with the Secretary of State in the manner specified by ORS 183.355 on or after the effective date of this 2015 Act and before January 1, 2016, and any rule filed with the Secretary of State during that period of time is void and of no effect.
  - (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any final rule filed with the Secretary of State in the manner specified by ORS 183.355 on or after the effective date of this 2015 Act that is based on a proposed rule for which notice was given under ORS 183.335 (1) before the effective date of this 2015 Act is void and of no effect.
  - SECTION 3. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage.

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
