**SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

*[Requires Oregon Health Authority to provide or contract for provision of training on adrenal insufficiency for certain health care professionals. Requires certain health care professionals to attend training.]*

*[Becomes operative January 1, 2016.]*

*[Declares emergency, effective on passage.]*

**Requires Oregon Health Authority to disseminate information to health care professionals and public related to adrenal insufficiency.**

**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

2 Relating to adrenal insufficiency.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) The Oregon Health Authority shall compile information on the following:**

5 **(a) The dangers associated with adrenal insufficiency;**

6 **(b) How to identify a person suffering an adrenal crisis; and**

7 **(c) The types of medications that treat adrenal insufficiency.**

8 **(2) The authority shall disseminate the information described in subsection (1) of this**  
9 **section to health care professionals and the public for the purpose of educating health care**  
10 **professionals and the public about adrenal insufficiency. The authority may disseminate the**  
11 **information through print or electronic publications, through video productions or by any**  
12 **other method determined to be cost-effective by the authority.**

13 **(3) In disseminating the information described in subsection (1) of this section, the au-**  
14 **thority shall consider the most effective means of providing the information to emergency**  
15 **medical services providers licensed under ORS chapter 682 and health care professionals who**  
16 **work in a hospital emergency department.**
