

Senate Bill 902

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Revives section 1, chapter 598, Oregon Laws 2013. Requires coordinated care organization to work with children's programs in developing community health improvement plan.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to cooperation of coordinated care organizations with providers of services to children in
3 developing plans; creating new provisions; amending section 1, chapter 598, Oregon Laws 2013;
4 repealing section 2, chapter 598, Oregon Laws 2013; and declaring an emergency.

5 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

6 **SECTION 1. Section 2, chapter 598, Oregon Laws 2013, is repealed.**

7 **SECTION 2. The repeal of section 2, chapter 598, Oregon Laws 2013, by section 1 of this**
8 **2015 Act revives section 1, chapter 598, Oregon Laws 2013. This 2015 Act shall be operative**
9 **retroactively to the date of the convening of the 2015 regular session of the Legislative As-**
10 **sembly, and the operation and effect of section 1, chapter 598, Oregon Laws 2013, shall con-**
11 **tinue unaffected from the date of the convening of the 2015 regular session of the Legislative**
12 **Assembly, to the effective date of this 2015 Act and thereafter. Any otherwise lawful action**
13 **taken or otherwise lawful obligation incurred under the authority of section 1, chapter 598,**
14 **Oregon Laws 2013, after the date of the convening of the 2015 regular session of the Legis-**
15 **lative Assembly, and before the effective date of this 2015 Act, is ratified and approved.**

16 **SECTION 3. Section 1, chapter 598, Oregon Laws 2013, is amended to read:**

17 **Sec. 1.** (1) A community health improvement plan adopted by a coordinated care organization
18 and its community advisory council in accordance with [*section 13, chapter 8, Oregon Laws 2012*]
19 **ORS 414.627**, shall include, to the extent practicable, a strategy and a plan for:

20 (a) Working with **programs developed by** the Early Learning Council, **Early Learning Hubs**,
21 the Youth Development Council and the school health providers in the region; and

22 (b) Coordinating the effective and efficient delivery of health care to children and adolescents
23 in the community.

24 (2) A community health improvement plan must be based on research, including research into
25 adverse childhood experiences, and must identify funding sources and additional funding necessary
26 to address the health needs of children and adolescents in the community and to meet the goals of
27 the plan. The plan must also:

28 (a) Evaluate the adequacy of the existing school-based health [*center network*] **resources in-**
29 **cluding school-based health centers and school nurses** to meet the specific pediatric and ado-
30 lescent health care needs in the community;

31 (b) Make recommendations to improve the school-based health center **and school nurse** system,

1 including the addition or improvement of electronic medical records and billing systems;

2 (c) Take into consideration whether integration of school-based health centers with the larger
3 health system or system of community clinics would further advance the goals of the plan;

4 (d) Improve the integration of all services provided to meet the needs of children, adolescents
5 and families;

6 (e) Focus on primary care, behavioral health and oral health; and

7 (f) Address promotion of health and prevention and early intervention in the treatment of chil-
8 dren and adolescents.

9 (3) A coordinated care organization shall involve in the development of its community health
10 improvement plan, school-based health centers, school nurses, school mental health providers and
11 individuals representing:

12 (a) **Programs developed by the Early Learning Council and Early Learning Hubs;**

13 (b) **Programs developed by the Youth Development Council in the region;**

14 (c) The Healthy Start Family Support Services program in the region;

15 (d) The Health Care for All Oregon Children program and other medical assistance programs;

16 (e) Relief nurseries in the region;

17 (f) Community health centers;

18 (g) Oral health care providers;

19 (h) Community mental health providers;

20 (i) Administrators of county health department programs that offer preventive health services
21 to children;

22 (j) Hospitals in the region; and

23 (k) Other appropriate child and adolescent health program administrators.

24 (4) The Oregon Health Authority may provide incentive grants to coordinated care organizations
25 for the purpose of contracting with individuals or organizations to help coordinate integration
26 strategies identified in the community health improvement plan adopted by the community advisory
27 council. The authority may also provide funds to coordinated care organizations to improve systems
28 of services that will promote the implementation of the plan.

29 (5) Each coordinated care organization shall report to the authority, in the form and manner
30 prescribed by the authority, on the progress of the integration strategies and implementation of the
31 plan for working with **the programs developed by the Early Learning Council, Early Learning**
32 **Hubs**, the Youth Development Council and school health care providers in the region, as part of the
33 development and implementation of the community health improvement plan. The authority shall
34 compile the information **biennially** and report the information to the Legislative Assembly by De-
35 cember 31[, 2014] **of each even-numbered year.**

36 **SECTION 4. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
37 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect**
38 **on its passage.**
