# Senate Bill 952

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON ENVIRONMENT AND NATURAL RESOURCES

### SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Establishes Task Force on Funding State Natural Resources Agencies to identify options for providing state natural resources agencies with stable or increased funding. Directs task force to report to Governor or committee of Legislative Assembly related to natural resources not later than February 1, 2016.

Sunsets task force December 31, 2016.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to the Task Force on Funding State Natural Resources Agencies; and declaring an emer-3 gency.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 SECTION 1. (1) The Task Force on Funding State Natural Resources Agencies is established, consisting of not fewer than nine or more than 15 members appointed as follows: 6

7 (a) The President of the Senate shall appoint two nonvoting members from among the

8 members of the Senate. The two members appointed under this paragraph may not be from 9 the same political party.

(b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint two nonvoting members 10 from among the members of the House of Representatives. The two members appointed un-11 12 der this paragraph may not be from the same political party.

(c) The Governor shall appoint not fewer than five or more than 11 members. In making 13 appointments to the task force, the Governor shall endeavor, to the extent the Governor 14 15deems practicable, to appoint members representative of interests of forest and agricultural landowners, the environmental conservation community, local government, Indian tribes, 16 industry, the recreation business community, hunting and fishing interests and the general 1718 public.

(2) The task force shall identify funding options that would provide stable or increased 19 funding for state natural resources agencies. The task force shall consider the option of re-20 21quiring that regulatory fees cover all costs of state natural resources agencies. As part of 22the option identification process, the task force shall consider:

23(a) The role of General Fund moneys in management of the natural resources of this 24 state for the benefit of all Oregonians;

25(b) Whether individual beneficiaries of state natural resources agency services should 26 have greater financial responsibility for the services they receive;

27(c) Options for preventing new state revenues from being used for purposes other than 28funding the state natural resources agencies;

29 (d) Options for ensuring that General Fund support is not reduced as a result of new

services provided by state natural resources agencies that would require new revenue 1 2 streams; (e) The practicability of proposed options, including but not limited to the logistics of 3 implementation and administration; 4  $\mathbf{5}$ (f) Whether the proposed options will result in stable or increased funding for the state natural resources agencies; and 6 (g) The equity of proposed options, including but not limited to equity among: 7 (A) Rural and urban areas; 8 9 (B) Particular communities; and 10 (C) Consumptive and conservation interests. (3) The task force may accept comments and exhibits from public and private sources. 11 12(4) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the 13 transaction of business. (5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the voting 14 15 members of the task force. (6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson. 16 (7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appoint-17ment to become immediately effective. 18 19 (8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the Governor or a representative of the Governor. 20(9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force. 2122(10) The task force shall submit a report describing the identified funding options in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to the 23Governor or an interim or regular committee of the Legislative Assembly related to natural 94 resources no later than February 1, 2016. 25(11) The Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall provide staff support to the 2627task force. (12) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are not 28entitled to compensation, but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary travel and other 2930 expenses incurred by them in the performance of their official duties in the manner and 31 amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. Claims for expenses incurred in performing functions of the task force shall be paid out of funds appropriated to the Oregon Department of Ad-32ministrative Services for purposes of the task force. 33 34 (13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist 35the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force 36 37 consider necessary to perform their duties. 38 (14) For purposes of this section, "state natural resources agencies" means the State Department of Agriculture, the State Department of Fish and Wildlife, the Columbia River 39 Gorge Commission, the Department of Environmental Quality, the State Forestry Depart-40 ment, the State Department of Geology and Mineral Industries, the State Parks and Recre-41 ation Department, the Department of Land Conservation and Development, the Department 42 of State Lands, the State Marine Board, the Water Resources Department and the Oregon 43 Watershed Enhancement Board. 44 45

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SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2015 Act is repealed on December 31, 2016.

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- 1 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
- 2 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect

3 on its passage.

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
