

Senate Bill 968

Sponsored by Senator EDWARDS

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Establishes state preemption of local governmental authority to mandate work schedule requirements until adjournment of 2017 regular session of Legislative Assembly. Provides exception. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to work schedule requirements; and declaring an emergency.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section:**

5 (a) **"Enact" includes but is not limited to adopt, amend, refer or pass with a delayed op-**
6 **erative or effective date.**

7 (b) **"Local government" includes a county, city, district or other public corporation, au-**
8 **thority or entity organized and existing under statute or city or county charter.**

9 (c) **"Work schedule" means the days and times during which an employee is required by**
10 **an employer to perform the duties for which the employee will receive compensation. "Work**
11 **schedule" does not include employee time off for medical reasons or sick time.**

12 (2) **The State of Oregon preempts all charter and statutory authority of local govern-**
13 **ments to enact a requirement relating to work schedules before the date of adjournment sine**
14 **die of the 2017 regular session of the Legislative Assembly.**

15 (3) **Notwithstanding subsection (2) of this section, a local government may set work**
16 **schedule requirements:**

17 (a) **For public employers; and**

18 (b) **In specifications for public contracts or subcontracts entered into by the local gov-**
19 **ernment.**

20 **SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2015 Act is repealed on August 31, 2017.**

21 **SECTION 3. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
22 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect**
23 **on its passage.**
