2 Whereas nearly 6,000 Oregonians have served as Peace Corps volunteers, with approximately 3 200 volunteers currently serving from Oregon; and

4 Whereas on a per capita basis, Oregon ranked fourth in the nation in sending Peace Corps 5 volunteers overseas during 2013; and

6 Whereas among large colleges and universities, the University of Oregon ranked eighth in the 7 nation in the number of undergraduate alumni Peace Corps volunteers in 2014; and

8 Whereas among small colleges and universities, Reed College ranked 14th in the number of 9 undergraduate alumni Peace Corps volunteers in 2014; and

10 Whereas the Peace Corps has educational partnerships with four universities in Oregon: the 11 University of Oregon, Oregon State University, Portland State University and Willamette Univer-12 sity; and

Whereas more than 3,000 Oregonians are connected with the National Peace Corps Association
(NPCA); and

15 Whereas Oregon NPCA member groups have supported and funded projects both locally and 16 internationally to promote development and humanitarian efforts since the 1980s; and

Whereas returning Peace Corps volunteers have served to bridge cultures and boost business between citizens of their service countries and citizens of the United States; and

Whereas the contributions and sacrifices of Peace Corps volunteers are not widely recognized;now, therefore,

21 Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:

That we, the members of the Seventy-eighth Legislative Assembly, recognize the contributions and sacrifices of Peace Corps volunteers from Oregon and throughout the United States and honor their work in the movement for peace and development.
