Senate Joint Resolution 17

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to recognize right to privacy.

Refers proposed amendment to people for their approval or rejection at next regular general section.

1	JOINT RESOLUTION
2	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
3	PARAGRAPH 1. The Constitution of the State of Oregon is amended by creating a new section
4	47 to be added to and made a part of Article I, such section to read:
5	SECTION 47. The right of individual privacy is essential to the well-being of a free society
6	and may not be infringed without a showing of a compelling state interest.

8	PARAGRAPH 2. The amendment proposed by this resolution shall be submitted to the
9	people for their approval or rejection at the next regular general election held throughout
10	this state.
