**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 13**

1 Delete lines 3 through 28 of the printed concurrent resolution and insert:

2 “Whereas McKinley Elementary School was named to honor William
3 McKinley, President of the United States from March 4, 1897, to September
4 14, 1901; and

5 “Whereas approximately 6,000 students have been enrolled and 19 princi-
6 pals have served at McKinley Elementary School since it opened; and

7 “Whereas McKinley Elementary School also served as a junior high
8 school early on and later as a community hospital during the Great
9 Pandemic of 1918-1919; and

10 “Whereas McKinley Elementary School, built in the stately Tudor Re-
11 vival style with subsequent additions, is included in the Oregon Historic
12 Sites Database maintained by the State Historic Preservation Office; and

13 “Whereas McKinley Elementary School students have demonstrated
14 strong academic success over time as measured by their high performance
15 levels on statewide assessments; and

16 “Whereas McKinley Elementary School is a vibrant, active and inclusive
17 community and a wondrous place for learning, with 100 years of special
18 memories and moments and where parent and community volunteers provide
19 unending support, logging approximately 1,500 volunteer hours each year;
20 and

21 “Whereas McKinley Elementary School has an adjacent city park that
22 was founded with the help of the South Central Association of Neighbors and

1 the City of Salem; and

2 “Whereas artists are invited each year to McKinley Elementary School,
3 often through the Salem Art Association’s Artist-in-Residence program, to
4 inspire students’ creativity, among them Daniel Dancer, Kiko Denzer and
5 Lynn Takata; and

6 “Whereas McKinley Elementary School has a farm-to-school garden under
7 the Oregon Farm-to-School and School Garden Program, allowing students
8 to cultivate curiosity and explore agriculture and sustainability with
9 hands-on experiences; and

10 “Whereas in 1997, McKinley Elementary School was the first Salem-
11 Keizer District 24J school to offer a full-day kindergarten program; and

12 “Whereas McKinley Elementary School has made great technological
13 strides since its first days, from hoisting a white flag outside to indicate the
14 end of recess in 1915 to using tablet computers and interactive whiteboards
15 in 2015; and

16 “Whereas students, teachers, parents and members of the community are
17 gathering on May 29, 2015, in a centennial celebration for McKinley Ele-
18 mentary School, which will include the Spring Garden Party, antique cars,
19 dedication of a new outdoor drinking fountain and recognition of principal
20 Annie Morton; now, therefore,”.
