

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO

4 **“2016 FUNDING ADJUSTMENTS**

5
6 **“SECTION 1.** ORS 459.235, as amended by section 8 of this 2015 Act, is
7 amended to read:

8 “459.235. (1) Applications for permits shall be on forms prescribed by the
9 Department of Environmental Quality. An application shall contain a de-
10 scription of the existing and proposed operation and the existing and pro-
11 posed facilities at the site, with detailed plans and specifications for any
12 facilities to be constructed. The application shall include a recommendation
13 by each local government unit having jurisdiction and such other informa-
14 tion the department deems necessary in order to determine whether the site
15 and solid waste disposal facilities located [*thereon*] **at the site** and the op-
16 eration will comply with applicable requirements.

17 “(2) The Environmental Quality Commission shall establish a schedule
18 of fees for disposal site permits. [*The permit fees contained in the schedule*
19 *shall be based on the anticipated cost of filing and investigating the applica-*
20 *tion, of issuing or denying the requested permit and of an inspection program*
21 *to determine compliance or noncompliance with the permit.*] **Consistent with**
22 **the policies in ORS 459.015, moneys collected under this section shall**

1 **be used to fund oversight activities related to solid waste disposal**
2 **sites, including but not limited to policy development, permitting, in-**
3 **specting, monitoring, enforcement, training, technical assistance, re-**
4 **sponding to complaints, rulemaking and any other activities that**
5 **support the safe management of solid waste.**

6 “[(3) *In addition to the fees imposed under subsection (2) of this section, the*
7 *commission shall establish a schedule of permit fees for the purpose of imple-*
8 *menting this section and ORS 90.318, 182.375, 279A.125, 279A.155, 279B.025,*
9 *279B.240, 279B.270, 279B.280, 459.005, 459.015, 459.247, 459.418, 459.995,*
10 *459A.005, 459A.010, 459A.020, 459A.030 to 459A.055, 459A.070, 459A.110,*
11 *459A.475, 459A.480, 459A.500 to 459A.685, 459A.695 and 459A.750. The fees*
12 *shall be based on the amount of solid waste received at the disposal site.]*

13 “[4] (3) Notwithstanding any other fee or surcharge imposed under ORS
14 459.005 to 459.437 or 459A.005 to 459A.120, for the disposal of solid waste, in
15 order to encourage the use of suitable material other than virgin material
16 for daily cover at a disposal site, the only fee that may be charged for the
17 disposal of substitute material that is also used for daily cover is the permit
18 fee established under this section.

19 **“SECTION 2.** ORS 459.236 is amended to read:

20 “459.236. (1) In addition to the permit fees provided in ORS 459.235, upon
21 prior approval by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services and a
22 report to the Emergency Board prior to adopting the fees, [*on January 1 of*
23 *each year*] there is imposed a fee on all:

24 “(a) Disposal sites that receive domestic solid waste [*except transfer*
25 *stations*] **or solid waste generated outside the state, for final disposal**
26 **or destruction;** and

27 “(b) Persons who transport solid waste out of the State of Oregon **for**
28 **final disposal or destruction** to a disposal site that receives domestic solid
29 waste.

30 “(2) The amount raised under subsection (1) of this section shall be up to

1 \$1 million per year, based on the estimated tonnage or the actual tonnage,
2 if known, received at the site or transported out of state for **final** disposal
3 **or destruction** and any other similar or related factors the Environmental
4 Quality Commission finds appropriate. Such fees shall be within the budget
5 authorized by the Legislative Assembly as that budget may be modified by
6 the Emergency Board.

7 “(3) For solid waste [*generated within the boundaries of*] **delivered to a**
8 **disposal site owned and operated by** a metropolitan service district, the
9 fee imposed under subsection (1) of this section[, *but not the permit fees pro-*
10 *vided in ORS 459.235 (3),*] shall be levied on the district, not the disposal
11 site.

12 “(4) Before transporting or arranging for transport of solid waste out of
13 the State of Oregon to a disposal site that receives domestic solid waste, a
14 person shall notify the Department of Environmental Quality in writing.

15 “(5)(a) A local government unit that franchises or licenses a domestic
16 solid waste site shall allow the disposal site to pass through the amount of
17 the fees established by the commission in subsection (1) of this section to the
18 users of the site.

19 “(b) If a disposal site that receives domestic solid waste passes through
20 all or a portion of the fees established by the commission in subsection (1)
21 of this section to a solid waste collector who uses the site, a local govern-
22 ment unit that franchises or licenses the collection of solid waste shall allow
23 the franchisee or licensee to include the amount of the fee in the collection
24 service rate.

25 “(6) Except as provided in subsection (7) of this section, moneys collected
26 under this section shall be deposited in the Orphan Site Account created
27 under ORS 465.381 to be used to pay the costs of removal or remedial action
28 of hazardous substances, in excess of the maximum amount collected under
29 ORS 459.311 at:

30 “(a) Solid waste disposal sites owned or operated by a local government

1 unit; or

2 “(b) Privately owned or operated solid waste disposal sites that receive
3 or received domestic solid waste for which the department determines the
4 responsible party is unknown, unwilling or unable to undertake any portion
5 or phase of a removal or remedial action.

6 “(7) The moneys collected under this section, or proceeds of any bond sale
7 under ORS 468.195 for which moneys collected under this section are pledged
8 for repayment shall be made available to a local government unit to pay re-
9 moval or remedial action costs at a site if:

10 “(a) The local government unit is responsible for conducting removal or
11 remedial action under ORS 465.260; and

12 “(b) The local government unit repays any moneys equal to the amount
13 that may be raised by the charge imposed under ORS 459.311 and interest
14 on such moneys, in accordance with an agreement between the local gov-
15 ernment unit and the department. A local government unit is not required
16 to repay the first \$100,000 the local government unit expends on removal or
17 remedial action.

18 “(8) As used in this section:

19 “(a) ‘Domestic solid waste’ has the meaning given that term in ORS
20 459A.100.

21 “(b) ‘Person’ does not include an individual who transports the
22 individual’s own residential solid waste to a disposal site located out of the
23 state.

24 “(c) ‘Removal’ and ‘remedial action’ have the [*meaning*] **meanings** given
25 those terms in ORS 465.200.

26 “**SECTION 3.** ORS 459A.025 is amended to read:

27 “459A.025. (1) According to the requirements of ORS chapter 183, the
28 Environmental Quality Commission shall adopt rules and guidelines neces-
29 sary to carry out the provisions of ORS 459.005, 459.015, 459.035, 459.250,
30 459.992 (1) and (2), 459.995 and 459A.005 to 459A.665, including but not lim-

1 ited to:

2 “(a) Acceptable alternative methods for providing the opportunity to re-
3 cycle;

4 “(b) Education, promotion and notice requirements, which requirements
5 may be different for disposal sites and collection systems;

6 “(c) Identification of the wastesheds within the state;

7 “(d) Identification of the principal recyclable material in each wasteshed;

8 “(e) Guidelines for local government units and other persons responsible
9 for implementing the provisions of ORS 459.005, 459.015, 459.035, 459.250,
10 459.992 (1) and (2), 459.995 and 459A.005 to 459A.665; **and**

11 “(f) Standards for the joint submission of the recycling reports required
12 under ORS 459A.050 (1).[; and]

13 “[g) *Subject to prior approval of the Oregon Department of Administrative*
14 *Services and a report to the Emergency Board prior to adopting the fee, the*
15 *amount of an annual or permit fee or both under ORS 459.235, 459.245 and*
16 *468.065 necessary to carry out the provisions of ORS 459.005, 459.015, 459.035,*
17 *459.250, 459.992 (1) and (2), 459.995 and 459A.005 to 459A.665.]*

18 “(2) In adopting rules or guidelines under this section, the commission
19 shall consider:

20 “(a) The policy stated in ORS 459.015.

21 “(b) Systems and techniques available for recycling, including but not
22 limited to existing recycling programs.

23 “(c) Availability of markets for recyclable material.

24 “(d) Costs of collecting, storing, transporting and marketing recyclable
25 material.

26 “(e) Avoided costs of disposal.

27 “(f) Density and characteristics of the population to be served.

28 “(g) Composition and quantity of solid waste generated and potential
29 recyclable material found in each wasteshed.

30 “**SECTION 4.** ORS 459A.110 is amended to read:

1 “459A.110. (1) In addition to the permit fees provided in ORS 459.235, the
2 Environmental Quality Commission shall establish a schedule of fees for all:

3 “(a) Disposal sites that receive domestic solid waste [*except transfer*
4 *stations*] **or solid waste generated outside the state, for final disposal**
5 **or destruction**; and

6 “(b) Persons who transport solid waste out of the State of Oregon **for**
7 **final disposal or destruction** to a disposal site that receives domestic solid
8 waste.

9 “**(2) If the amount of waste tonnage per calendar year subject to the**
10 **fees established under subsection (1) of this section falls, for two con-**
11 **secutive calendar years, below 90 percent of the amount of waste**
12 **tonnage subject to the fees as averaged over the 2014 to 2016 calendar**
13 **years, the commission may establish a schedule of fees for disposal**
14 **sites for composting. A fee schedule established under this subsection**
15 **shall:**

16 “**(a) Apply only to tonnage received by a disposal site for**
17 **composting that is in excess of the first 5,000 tons received per year**
18 **by the disposal site; and**

19 “**(b) Remain in effect unless or until the commission determines**
20 **that a fee under this subsection is no longer necessary.**

21 “[~~(2)~~] **(3)** [*The schedule adopted under subsection (1)*] **Fees adopted under**
22 **subsections (1) and (2)** of this section shall be based on the estimated
23 tonnage or the actual tonnage, if known, received at the site or transported
24 out of state for disposal and any other similar or related factors the com-
25 mission finds appropriate. [*The fees collected pursuant to the schedule shall*
26 *be sufficient to assist in the funding of programs to reduce the amount of do-*
27 *mestic solid waste generated in Oregon and to reduce environmental risks at*
28 *domestic waste disposal sites.*]

29 “[~~(3)~~] **(4)** For solid waste delivered to a disposal site owned or operated
30 by a metropolitan service district, the schedule of fees, but not the permit

1 fees provided in ORS 459.235, established by the commission in subsection (1)
2 of this section shall be levied on the district, not the disposal site.

3 “[~~(4)~~] (5) The commission also may require submittal of information re-
4 lated to volumes and sources of solid waste if necessary to carry out the
5 activities **described** in ORS 459A.120. For solid waste transported out of the
6 State of Oregon for **final disposal or destruction**, the required information
7 may include the type of solid waste, the county of origin of the solid waste
8 and the state to which the solid waste is transported for final disposal **or**
9 **destruction**.

14 site that receives domestic solid waste shall allow the disposal site to pass

17 “(b) If a disposal site that receives domestic solid waste passes through

27 *shall be an amount equal to the sum of the fees established under subsection*
28 *(1) of this section and ORS 459A.115 and shall be collected in the same man-*
29 *ner as fees established under subsection (1) of this section and ORS*
30 *459A.115.*]

1 “[9] (8) As used in this section, ‘person’ does not include an individual
2 who transports the individual’s own residential solid waste to a disposal site
3 located out of the state.

4 **“SECTION 5. ORS 459A.115 is repealed.**

5 **“SECTION 6. (1) The fees generated under ORS 459A.110 shall be
6 sufficient to accomplish the purposes set forth in ORS 459A.120, pro-
7 vided that:**

8 **“(a) The fees established under ORS 459A.110 (1) shall be no more
9 than \$1.18 per ton for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015; and**

10 **“(b) Any per-ton fee on disposal sites for composting under ORS
11 459A.110 (2) shall be no more than the per-ton fee assessed on domestic
12 solid waste disposal under ORS 459A.110 (1), less \$0.81 per ton.**

13 **“(2) For the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and each subsequent

8 **of Environmental Quality shall provide a rebate of the fees established**
9 **under ORS 459A.110 to the nine most economically distressed counties**
10 **in this state.**

11 **“(b) The department shall annually identify the counties that will**
12 **receive the rebate provided for under this section and, no later than**
13 **January 31 of each year, provide notice to:**

14 **“(A) Each of the economically distressed counties identified by the**
15 **department that will receive the rebate calculated under subsection (2)**
16 **of this section for the calendar year; and**

17 **“(B) Each of the counties that received a rebate during the previous**
18 **calendar year.**

19 **“(2)(a) For the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, the amount of the**
20 **rebate provided to an economically distressed county under this sec-**
21 **tion shall be no more than \$0.28 per:**

22 **“(A) Each ton of solid waste disposed that was generated within the**
23 **economically distressed county during the previous calendar year; or**

24 **“(B) If the department calculates an adjustment under paragraph**
25 **(c) of this subsection, each adjusted ton of solid waste disposed that**
26 **was generated within the economically distressed county during the**
27 **previous calendar year.**

28 **“(b) For the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and each subsequent**
29 **biennium, if the Environmental Quality Commission adjusts the fees**
30 **established under ORS 459A.110 pursuant to section 6 (2) of this 2015**

1 **Act, the commission shall also proportionally adjust the amount of the**
2 **per-ton rebate specified in paragraph (a) of this subsection.**

3 **“(c)(A) The department shall calculate the total tonnage of solid**
4 **waste disposed that was generated in a calendar year within all of the**
5 **economically distressed counties identified under subsection (1) of this**
6 **section.**

7 **“(B) If the total for all economically distressed counties is greater**
8 **than 10 percent of all solid waste disposed of in this state during the**
9 **same calendar year, the department may calculate an adjusted**
10 **tonnage for each economically distressed county for purposes of cal-**
11 **culating the rebate provided for under this section.**

12 **“(C) The adjusted tonnage for each economically distressed county**
13 **shall be proportional to the actual tonnage generated and calculated**
14 **such that the sum of the adjusted tonnage for all of the economically**
15 **distressed counties is equal to 10 percent of all solid waste disposed**
16 **of in this state during the calendar year.**

17 **“(3) If a city within an economically distressed county owns and**
18 **operates a landfill, the department shall distribute the portion of the**
19 **rebate for the economically distressed county that is calculated based**
20 **on tons of solid waste disposed that was generated in the county and**
21 **disposed of at the landfill owned by the city to the city instead of the**
22 **county.**

23 **“(4) Moneys received by a city or county pursuant to the rebate**
24 **program provided for under this section may be used only for:**

25 **“(a) Purposes authorized in ORS 459A.120;**

26 **“(b) The operation of solid waste disposal facilities; or**

27 **“(c) The reduction of disposal fees.**

28 **“(5)(a) The commission shall adopt rules to carry out the provisions**
29 **of this section. Rules adopted under this subsection shall include:**

30 **“(A) A methodology for identifying the most economically dis-**

1 **tressed counties in this state; and**

2 **“(B) A process for providing rebates to the economically distressed**
3 **counties.**

4 **“(b) The methodology for identifying economically distressed coun-**
5 **ties adopted under this subsection may be based on a methodology**
6 **adopted by the Oregon Business Development Department by rule un-**
7 **der ORS 285A.020 and 285A.075.**

9 **“(a) ‘Landfill’ has the meaning given that term in ORS 459.005; and**

10 **“(b) ‘Solid waste disposed’ has the meaning given that term in ORS**
11 **459A.010 (4)(h).”.**

13 **“459A.120. (1) [*Except as provided in ORS 459A.115,*] The fees established**
14 **by the Environmental Quality Commission under ORS 459A.110 shall be de-**
15 **posited in the General Fund and credited to an account of the Department**
16 **of Environmental Quality. Such moneys are continuously appropriated to the**
17 **department to [*carry out the purposes set forth in subsection (2) of this***
18 ***section.*] fund the update and implementation of the statewide inte-**
19 **grated solid waste management plan under ORS 459A.020 and the pol-**
20 **icies set forth in ORS 459.015.**

21 **“(2) Activities that may be funded to carry out the purposes of this**
22 **section include but are not limited to:**

23 **“(a) Activities to reduce the environmental and human health im-**
24 **pacts of materials at all stages of their life cycles, such as:**

25 **“(A) Promoting and enhancing waste prevention, recycling and**
26 **other waste recovery activities;**

27 **“(B) Collecting data;**

28 **“(C) Researching, planning, developing and applying performance**
29 **measures;**

30 **“(D) Developing standards and educational and promotional activ-**

1 **ities;**

2 **“(E) Supporting markets;**

3 **“(F) Demonstrating activities; and**

23 *vice district, as approved by the department, including planning for special*
24 *waste disposal, planning for closure of solid waste disposal sites, capacity*
25 *planning for domestic solid waste and regional solid waste planning.]*

26 *“(e) Grants to local government units for recycling and solid waste plan-*
27 *ning activities.]*

28 *“(f) Payment of administrative costs incurred by the department in accom-*
29 *plishing the purposes set forth in this section. The amount allocated under this*
30 *paragraph shall not exceed 10 percent of the fees generated under ORS*

25 **SECTION 12.** ORS 459.236, as amended by section 2 of this 2015 Act, is
26 amended to read:

27 “459.236. (1) In addition to the permit fees provided in ORS 459.235, upon
28 prior approval by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services and a
29 report to the Emergency Board prior to adopting the fees, there is imposed
30 a fee on all:

1 “(a) Disposal sites that receive domestic solid waste, **building demolition**
2 **or construction wastes, land clearing debris, waste tires** or solid waste
3 generated outside the state, for final disposal or destruction; and

4 “(b) Persons who transport solid waste out of the State of Oregon for final
5 disposal or destruction to a disposal site that receives domestic solid waste,
6 **building demolition or construction wastes, land clearing debris or**
7 **waste tires.**

8 “(2) The amount raised under subsection (1) of this section shall be up to
9 \$1 million per year, based on the estimated tonnage or the actual tonnage,
10 if known, received at the site or transported out of state for final disposal
11 or destruction and any other similar or related factors the Environmental
12 Quality Commission finds appropriate. Such fees shall be within the budget
13 authorized by the Legislative Assembly as that budget may be modified by
14 the Emergency Board.

15 “(3) For solid waste delivered to a disposal site owned and operated by a
16 metropolitan service district, the fee imposed under subsection (1) of this
17 section shall be levied on the district, not the disposal site.

18 “(4) Before transporting or arranging for transport of solid waste out of
19 the State of Oregon to a disposal site that receives domestic solid waste, a
20 person shall notify the Department of Environmental Quality in writing.

21 “(5)(a) A local government unit that franchises or licenses a domestic
22 solid waste site shall allow the disposal site to pass through the amount of
23 the fees established by the commission in subsection (1) of this section to the
24 users of the site.

25 “(b) If a disposal site that receives domestic solid waste passes through
26 all or a portion of the fees established by the commission in subsection (1)
27 of this section to a solid waste collector who uses the site, a local govern-
28 ment unit that franchises or licenses the collection of solid waste shall allow
29 the franchisee or licensee to include the amount of the fee in the collection
30 service rate.

1 “(6) Except as provided in subsection (7) of this section, moneys collected
2 under this section shall be deposited in the Orphan Site Account created
3 under ORS 465.381 to be used to pay the costs of removal or remedial action
4 of hazardous substances, in excess of the maximum amount collected under
5 ORS 459.311 at:

6 “(a) Solid waste disposal sites owned or operated by a local government
7 unit; or

8 “(b) Privately owned or operated solid waste disposal sites that receive
9 or received domestic solid waste for which the department determines the
10 responsible party is unknown, unwilling or unable to undertake any portion
11 or phase of a removal or remedial action.

12 “(7) The moneys collected under this section, or proceeds of any bond sale
13 under ORS 468.195 for which moneys collected under this section are pledged
14 for repayment shall be made available to a local government unit to pay re-
15 moval or remedial action costs at a site if:

16 “(a) The local government unit is responsible for conducting removal or
17 remedial action under ORS 465.260; and

18 “(b) The local government unit repays any moneys equal to the amount
19 that may be raised by the charge imposed under ORS 459.311 and interest
20 on such moneys, in accordance with an agreement between the local gov-
21 ernment unit and the department. A local government unit is not required
22 to repay the first \$100,000 the local government unit expends on removal or
23 remedial action.

24 “(8) As used in this section:

25 “(a) ‘Domestic solid waste’ has the meaning given that term in ORS
26 459A.100.

27 “(b) ‘Person’ does not include an individual who transports the
28 individual’s own residential solid waste to a disposal site located out of the
29 state.

30 “(c) ‘Removal’ and ‘remedial action’ have the meanings given those terms

1 in ORS 465.200.

2 **“SECTION 13.** ORS 459A.110, as amended by section 4 of this 2015 Act,
3 is amended to read:

4 “459A.110. (1) In addition to the permit fees provided in ORS 459.235, the
5 Environmental Quality Commission shall establish a schedule of fees for all:

6 “(a) Disposal sites that receive domestic solid waste, **building demolition**
7 **or construction waste, land clearing debris, waste tires** or solid waste
8 generated outside the state, for final disposal or destruction; and

9 “(b) Persons who transport solid waste out of the State of Oregon for final
10 disposal or destruction to a disposal site that receives domestic solid waste,
11 **building demolition or construction waste, land clearing debris or**
12 **waste tires.**

13 “(2) If the amount of waste tonnage per calendar year subject to the fees
14 established under subsection (1) of this section falls, for two consecutive
15 calendar years, below 90 percent of the amount of waste tonnage subject to
16 the fees as averaged over the 2014 to 2016 calendar years, the commission
17 may establish a schedule of fees for disposal sites for composting. A fee
18 schedule established under this subsection shall:

19 “(a) Apply only to tonnage received by a disposal site for composting that
20 is in excess of the first 5,000 tons received per year by the disposal site; and

21 “(b) Remain in effect unless or until the commission determines that a fee
22 under this subsection is no longer necessary.

23 “(3) Fees adopted under subsections (1) and (2) of this section shall be
24 based on the estimated tonnage or the actual tonnage, if known, received at
25 the site or transported out of state for disposal and any other similar or re-
26 lated factors the commission finds appropriate.

27 “(4) For solid waste delivered to a disposal site owned or operated by a
28 metropolitan service district, the schedule of fees, but not the permit fees
29 provided in ORS 459.235, established by the commission in subsection (1) of
30 this section shall be levied on the district, not the disposal site.

1 “(5) The commission also may require submittal of information related to
2 volumes and sources of solid waste if necessary to carry out the activities
3 described in ORS 459A.120. For solid waste transported out of the State of
4 Oregon for final disposal or destruction, the required information may in-
5 clude the type of solid waste, the county of origin of the solid waste and the
6 state to which the solid waste is transported for final disposal or destruction.

7 “(6) Before transporting or arranging for transport of solid waste out of
8 the State of Oregon to a disposal site that receives domestic solid waste, a
9 person shall notify the Department of Environmental Quality in writing.

10 “(7)(a) A local government that franchises or licenses a disposal site that
11 receives domestic solid waste shall allow the disposal site to pass through
12 the amount of the fees established by the commission in subsections (1) and
13 (2) of this section to the users of the site.

14 “(b) If a disposal site that receives domestic solid waste passes through
15 all or a portion of the fees established by the commission in subsections (1)
16 and (2) of this section to a solid waste collector who uses the site, a local
17 government that franchises or licenses the collection of solid waste shall
18 allow the franchisee or licensee to include the amount of the fee in the col-
19 lection service rate.

20 “(8) As used in this section, ‘person’ does not include an individual who
21 transports the individual’s own residential solid waste to a disposal site lo-
22 cated out of the state.

23 **“SECTION 14. The amendments to ORS 459.236 and 459A.110 by**
24 **sections 12 and 13 of this 2015 Act become operative on April 1, 2019.**

25 **“SECTION 15. Fees imposed pursuant to the amendments to ORS**
26 **459.236 and 459A.110 by sections 12 and 13 of this 2015 Act shall first**
27 **become due and payable no earlier than July 1, 2019.**

28 **“SECTION 16. The Environmental Quality Commission and the**
29 **Department of Environmental Quality may take any action before the**
30 **operative date specified in section 14 of this 2015 Act that is necessary**

1 for the commission or the department to exercise, on and after the
2 operative date specified in section 14 of this 2015 Act, all of the duties,
3 functions and powers conferred on the commission or the department
4 by the amendments to ORS 459.236 and 459A.110 by sections 12 and 13
5 of this 2015 Act.

7 **“OUT-OF-REGION FEE DIFFERENTIAL REPEALED**

9 **“SECTION 17. ORS 459.112 and 459.114 are repealed.**

11 **“REPORT**

12
13 **“SECTION 18. No later than October 31, 2022, the Department of
14 Environmental Quality shall submit a report in the manner provided
15 by ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to
16 the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly having subject
17 matter jurisdiction over the environment and natural resources. The
18 report shall include:**

19 **“(1) Information on options for sustainable and adequate funding
20 of solid waste management, prevention, reuse and recycling programs;**

21 **“(2) An evaluation of the effectiveness and value of the fee rebate
22 program provided for under section 6a of this 2015 Act; and**

23 **“(3) Information on the implementation of the state’s plan for an
24 integrated system of materials and waste management in the State of
25 Oregon, as adopted in accordance with ORS 459A.020.**
