

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO  
SENATE BILL 941**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after “ORS” delete the rest of the  
2 line and delete lines 3 and 4 and insert “802.200 and 807.110; and declaring  
3 an emergency.”.

4 Delete lines 6 through 24 and delete pages 2 through 23 and insert:

5 **“SECTION 1. (1) Every court of this state with jurisdiction over  
6 felony offenses shall forward to the Department of Transportation a  
7 record of the conviction of any person convicted of a felony within 24  
8 hours of the time the person is sentenced.**

9 **“(2) A judge or clerk of the court may comply with the requirement  
10 described in subsection (1) of this section by:**

11 **“(a) Sending the department an abstract of conviction for any per-  
12 son who is convicted of a felony; and**

13 **“(b) Sending the department a copy of any final judgment of con-  
14 viction of any person convicted of a felony.**

15 **“(3) The department shall receive any record transmitted pursuant  
16 to this section from the court concerning a person’s felony conviction  
17 and shall maintain a record of the conviction as described in ORS  
18 802.200.**

19 **“SECTION 2. (1) No later than September 1, 2015, the Department  
20 of State Police shall perform a search of the department’s criminal  
21 offender information and shall provide information sufficient to iden-  
22 tify all persons who have been convicted of a felony in this state to**

1 **the Department of Transportation.**

2 **“(2) The Department of Transportation shall receive any record**  
3 **transmitted pursuant to this section from the Department of State**  
4 **Police concerning a person’s felony conviction and shall maintain a**  
5 **record of the conviction as described in ORS 802.200.**

6 **“SECTION 3.** ORS 807.110 is amended to read:

7 “807.110. (1) A license issued by the Department of Transportation shall  
8 contain all of the following:

9 “(a) The distinguishing number assigned to the person issued the license  
10 by the department.

11 “(b) For the purpose of identification, a brief description of the person to  
12 whom the license is issued.

13 “(c) The full legal name of the person to whom the license is issued, ex-  
14 cept that the department may limit the number of characters displayed on  
15 the license.

16 “(d) The date of birth of the person to whom the license is issued.

17 “(e) Except as provided for corrections officers in ORS 802.253, eligible  
18 employees in ORS 802.250 or Address Confidentiality Program participants  
19 in ORS 192.846, the residence address of the person to whom the license is  
20 issued.

21 “(f) Upon request of the person to whom the license is issued, the fact  
22 that the person is an anatomical donor.

23 “(g) Upon request of the person to whom the license is issued and pres-  
24 entation of proof, as determined by the department, the fact that the person  
25 is a veteran, as defined in ORS 408.225.

26 “(h) Upon order of the juvenile court, the fact that the person to whom  
27 the license is issued is an emancipated minor.

28 **“(i) The fact that the person to whom the license is issued has been**  
29 **convicted of a felony.**

30 “[*i*] (j) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2) of this section, a

1 photograph described in this paragraph. A photograph required under this  
2 paragraph shall:

3 “(A) Be a full-faced, color photograph of the person to whom the license  
4 is issued;

5 “(B) Be of a size approved by the department; and

6 “(C) Be taken at the time of application for issuance of the license  
7 whether the application is for an original license, replacement of a license  
8 under ORS 807.160 or for renewal of a license under ORS 807.150, except that  
9 the department, by rule, may allow the applicant to use a photograph already  
10 on file with the department.

11 “[~~j~~] (**k**) The class of license issued and any endorsements granted. If the  
12 license is a commercial driver license, the words ‘commercial driver license’  
13 or the letters ‘CDL’ shall appear on the license.

14 “[~~k~~] (**L**) The signature of the person to whom the license is issued.

15 “(2) The department may issue a valid license without a photograph to  
16 an applicant who objects either on religious grounds or because of the  
17 applicant’s facial disfigurement.

18 “(3) A limited term driver license issued under ORS 807.730 shall indicate:

19 “(a) That it is a limited term driver license; and

20 “(b) The date on which the limited term driver license expires.

21 “(4) The department shall use security procedures, processes and materials  
22 in the preparation, manufacture and issuance of any license that prohibit as  
23 nearly as possible anyone’s ability to alter, counterfeit, duplicate or modify  
24 the license without ready detection. The security features used in the pro-  
25 duction of the licenses shall provide for:

26 “(a) The authentication of a genuine document in a reasonable time; and

27 “(b) The production of the license only by equipment that requires ver-  
28 ification of the identity of the operator of the equipment before a license  
29 may be produced.

30 “**SECTION 4.** ORS 802.200 is amended to read:

1 “802.200. In addition to any other records the Department of Transporta-  
2 tion may establish, the department is subject to the following provisions  
3 concerning records:

4 “(1) The department shall maintain records concerning the titling of ve-  
5 hicles in this state. The records under this subsection shall include the fol-  
6 lowing:

7 “(a) For vehicles issued a title by this state, the records shall identify the  
8 vehicle and contain the following:

9 “(A) The name of the vehicle owner and any security interest holders in  
10 order of priority, except that a security interest holder need not be identified  
11 if the debtor who granted the interest is in the business of selling vehicles  
12 and the vehicles constitute inventory held for sale;

13 “(B) The name of any lessor of the vehicle;

14 “(C) The vehicle description; and

15 “(D) Whether a certificate of title was issued for the vehicle.

16 “(b) If the vehicle is an antique vehicle that is reconstructed, the records  
17 shall indicate that the vehicle is reconstructed.

18 “(c) If the vehicle is a replica, the records shall indicate that the vehicle  
19 is a replica.

20 “(d) Any other information concerning the titling of vehicles that the  
21 department considers convenient or appropriate.

22 “(e) All odometer disclosures and readings for a vehicle that are reported  
23 to the department under provisions of the vehicle code. The department shall  
24 keep the most recent version of records required under this paragraph in  
25 electronic form.

26 “(f) If the vehicle has been reported to the department as a totaled vehicle  
27 under the provisions of ORS 819.012 or 819.014, the records shall indicate  
28 that the vehicle is a totaled vehicle unless the reason for the report was  
29 theft and the vehicle has been recovered.

30 “(2) If a vehicle that has been registered or titled in another jurisdiction

1 is registered or titled in this state, the department shall retain a record of  
2 any odometer readings shown on the title or registration documents submit-  
3 ted to the department at the time of registration or title.

4 “(3) Except as otherwise provided in ORS 826.003, the department shall  
5 maintain records concerning the registration of vehicles required to be reg-  
6 istered by the department. The records concerning the registration of vehi-  
7 cles may be stored along with records concerning the titling of vehicles. The  
8 records under this subsection shall include the following:

9 “(a) For vehicles registered by the department, the records shall identify  
10 the vehicle and contain the following:

11 “(A) The registration plate number assigned by the department to the  
12 vehicle;

13 “(B) The name of the vehicle owner;

14 “(C) The vehicle description and vehicle identification number; and

15 “(D) An indication that the vehicle is a totaled vehicle if it has been re-  
16 ported to the department as a totaled vehicle under the provisions of ORS  
17 819.012 or 819.014, unless the reason for the report was theft and the vehicle  
18 has been recovered.

19 “(b) Any other information concerning the registration of vehicles that  
20 the department considers convenient or appropriate.

21 “(4) The department shall maintain separate records for the regulation  
22 of vehicle dealers. The records required under this subsection shall include  
23 the following information about persons issued dealer certificates:

24 “(a) The person’s application for a vehicle dealer certificate.

25 “(b) An alphabetical index of the name of each person applying for a ve-  
26 hicle dealer certificate.

27 “(c) A numerical index according to the distinctive number assigned to  
28 each vehicle dealer.

29 “(5) The department shall maintain a file on vehicles for which the title  
30 record is canceled under ORS 819.030. The records required under this sub-

1 section shall disclose the last registered owner of each vehicle, any security  
2 interest holder or holders and lessors of each vehicle as shown by the can-  
3 celed title record for each vehicle and the make and year model for each  
4 vehicle.

5 “(6) The department shall maintain a record of each agreement or decla-  
6 ration under ORS 802.500 and 802.520.

7 “(7) The department shall maintain separate and comprehensive records  
8 of all transactions affecting the Revolving Account for Emergency Cash  
9 Advances described under ORS 802.100.

10 “(8) The department shall maintain suitable records of driver licenses,  
11 driver permits and identification cards. The records required under this  
12 subsection shall include all of the following:

13 “(a) An index by name and number.

14 “(b) Supporting documentation of all driver licenses, driver permits or  
15 identification cards issued.

16 “(c) Every application for a driver license, driver permit or identification  
17 card.

18 “(d) All driver licenses or driver permits that have been suspended or  
19 revoked.

20 “(e) For each driver license, driver permit or identification card, the So-  
21 cial Security number of the person to whom the driver license, driver permit  
22 or identification card is issued or proof that the person is not eligible for a  
23 Social Security number.

24 “(f) For each commercial driver license, the Social Security number of the  
25 person to whom the license is issued, or any other number or identifying  
26 information that the Secretary of the United States Department of Trans-  
27 portation determines appropriate to identify the person.

28 “(9) The Department of Transportation shall maintain a two-part driving  
29 record consisting of an employment driving record and a nonemployment  
30 driving record for each person as required under this subsection. All of the

1 following apply to the records required under this subsection:

2 “(a) The department shall maintain driving records on:

3 “(A) Every person who is granted driving privileges under a driver li-  
4 cense, driver permit or a statutory grant of driving privileges under ORS  
5 807.020;

6 “(B) Every person whose driving privileges have been suspended, revoked  
7 or canceled under this vehicle code;

8 “(C) Every person who has filed an accident report under ORS 811.725 or  
9 811.730; and

10 “(D) Every person who is required to provide future responsibility filings  
11 under ORS 806.200, 806.220, 806.230 or 806.240.

12 “(b) In addition to other information required by this paragraph, the em-  
13 ployment driving record shall include all reports of drug test results that are  
14 made to the department under ORS 825.410 or 825.415. Notwithstanding any  
15 other provision of law, release of the portion of the employment driving re-  
16 cord that shows drug test results reported under ORS 825.410 or 825.415 is  
17 permitted only in accordance with ORS 802.202. The employment driving re-  
18 cord shall also include all motor vehicle accidents that the person is required  
19 to report under ORS 811.720, all suspensions of driving privileges required  
20 to be placed on the record under ORS 809.280, all suspensions of the person’s  
21 commercial driver license that result from operation or use of a commercial  
22 motor vehicle and all convictions of the person for violation of motor vehicle  
23 laws except convictions for offenses requiring mandatory revocation or sus-  
24 pension of driving privileges under ORS 809.409, 809.411, 809.413 and 813.400,  
25 but shall include only such accidents, suspensions and convictions that occur  
26 while the person is driving a motor vehicle:

27 “(A) In the course of the person’s employment when the person is em-  
28 ployed by another for the principal purpose of driving a motor vehicle;

29 “(B) Carrying persons or property for compensation;

30 “(C) In the course of the person’s employment in the collection, trans-

1 portation or delivery of mail if the vehicle is government owned or marked  
2 for the collection, transportation or delivery of mail in accordance with  
3 government rules;

4 “(D) That is an authorized emergency vehicle;

5 “(E) That is a commercial motor vehicle; or

6 “(F) In the course of the person’s employment with a federal, state or lo-  
7 cal government in a public works project involving repair or maintenance  
8 of water, sewer or road systems.

9 “(c) The nonemployment driving record shall include the person’s:

10 “(A) Motor vehicle accidents that the person is required to report under  
11 ORS 811.720, other than the motor vehicle accidents that are included on the  
12 person’s employment driving record;

13 “(B) Suspensions, cancellations and revocations of licenses, permits and  
14 driving privileges;

15 “(C) Convictions for violation of the motor vehicle laws other than those  
16 included in the employment driving record including, for each violation of  
17 ORS 811.100 or 811.111, the speed at which the person was convicted of  
18 traveling and the posted speed, the speed limit or the speed that constitutes  
19 prima facie evidence of violation of the basic speed rule, as appropriate;  
20 [*and*]

21 “(D) Diversion agreements entered into under ORS 813.220 within the  
22 preceding 15 years[.]; **and**

23 **“(E) Convictions for any felony.**

24 “(d) The department may record other entries to indicate correspondence,  
25 interviews, participation in driver improvement programs or other matters  
26 concerning the status of the driving privileges of the person.

27 “(e) When a person from another jurisdiction applies for a driver license  
28 or driver permit issued by this state, the department shall request a copy of  
29 the person’s driving record from the other jurisdiction. At the time the per-  
30 son is issued a license in Oregon, the record from the other jurisdiction shall



1 become part of the driver's record in this state with the same force and effect  
2 as though entered on the driver's record in this state in the original in-  
3 stance. The department by rule may specify methods for converting entries  
4 from out-of-state records for use in Oregon.

5 “(f) When a suspension of a driver permit, driver license or other driving

10 “(c) When the permit was issued.

11 “(d) The type of permit issued.

12 “(e) For registration weight trip permits, the maximum allowable regis-  
13 tration weight permitted for operation under the permit.

14 “(f) Any other information the department determines appropriate or  
15 convenient.

16 **“SECTION 6. The amendments to ORS 802.200 and 807.110 by**  
17 **sections 3 to 5 of this 2015 Act apply to driver licenses, driver permits**
