

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 186**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 17 through 23 and insert:

2 “(3) An entity that acquires premeasured doses of epinephrine and the
3 necessary paraphernalia for administration pursuant to subsection (2) of this
4 section may make the epinephrine available to a person described in ORS
5 433.825 (1) for administration to a person believed to be suffering a severe
6 allergic response.

7 “(4)(a) An entity that acquires premeasured doses of epinephrine and the
8 necessary paraphernalia for administration pursuant to subsection (2) of this
9 section may make the epinephrine available to any person if the entity keeps
10 the epinephrine and the necessary paraphernalia in a locked, secure con-
11 tainer that may be remotely unlocked and to which a communication device
12 is attached that allows a person to consult with a practitioner who has
13 prescriptive privileges.

14 “(b) In an emergency situation, a practitioner who has prescriptive privi-
15 leges may authorize a person who consults with the practitioner using a
16 communication device described in paragraph (a) of this subsection to pos-
17 sess and administer a premeasured dose of epinephrine to an individual that
18 a person believes in good faith is suffering a severe allergic response.”.

19 In line 24, delete “(4)” and insert “(5)”.

20 On page 2, delete line 19 and insert:

21 “(8) ‘Physician assistant’ means a physician assistant licensed under ORS
22 chapter 677.

1 “(9) ‘Practitioner who has prescriptive privileges’ means a health care
2 practitioner authorized by law to administer or prescribe prescriptive drugs
3 in this state or in the state in which the health care practitioner resides.”.

4 In line 33, after “physician” insert “, physician assistant”.

5 In line 43, after “physician” insert “, physician assistant”.

6 On page 3, line 1, after “physician” insert “, physician assistant”.

7 In line 39, delete “(3)(b)” and insert “(4)(b)”.
