

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO  
SENATE BILL 94**

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, after “planning” insert “; and declaring an  
2 emergency”.

3 After line 9, insert:

4 **“SECTION 2. (1)(a) In preparation for an emergency as defined in**  
5 **ORS 401.025 that is related to a seismic event, the Office of Emergency**  
6 **Management shall advertise for, solicit and receive bids or proposals**  
7 **for and enter into a price agreement as provided in ORS 279B.140 with**  
8 **a contractor that can provide, when needed, a helicopter that is ca-**  
9 **pable of lifting heavy loads. The office shall enter into the price**  
10 **agreement for the longest term to which the contractor agrees and**  
11 **may renew the price agreement under the existing terms and condi-**  
12 **tions without a further competitive process if the office believes the**  
13 **public interest so requires.**

14 **“(b) The office may prequalify prospective bidders or proposers un-**  
15 **der ORS 279B.120 on the basis of the bidders’ or proposers’ available**  
16 **equipment, training, expertise and capabilities and on the basis of the**  
17 **types of services the office expects to require.**

18 **“(2)(a) A local contracting agency, as defined in ORS 279A.010, may**  
19 **procure services under the price agreement into which the office en-**  
20 **ters under subsection (1) of this section by conducting a cooperative**  
21 **procurement with the office under ORS 279A.200 to 279A.225.**

22 **“(b) A local government may request through an intergovernmental**

1 agreement under ORS chapter 190 that the office, on the local  
2 government's behalf, enter into a contract for services with a con-  
3 tractor with which the office has a price agreement under subsection  
4 (1)(a) of this section and that the office has prequalified under sub-  
5 section (1)(b) of this section. If a local government makes a request  
6 under this paragraph, the local government in the intergovernmental  
7 agreement shall agree to reimburse the office for all expenditures that  
8 the office makes under the terms of the contract for services.

9 “(c) The office, in response to a request from a local government,  
10 may conduct an emergency procurement in accordance with ORS  
11 279B.080 and under the terms and conditions of a price agreement into  
12 which the office enters under subsection (1) of this section if the local  
13 contracting agency agrees to reimburse the office for all expenditures  
14 the office makes in connection with the emergency procurement.

15 “(3) The Office of Emergency Management shall adopt rules to im-  
16 plement the provisions of this section.

17 “SECTION 3. (1) Sections 1 and 2 of this 2015 Act become operative  
18 January 1, 2016.

19 “(2) The Director of the Office of Emergency Management and the  
20 Land Conservation and Development Commission may adopt rules and  
21 take any other action before the operative date specified in subsection  
22 (1) of this section that is necessary to enable the director or the com-  
23 mission, on and after the operative date specified in subsection (1) of  
24 this section, to exercise the duties, functions and powers conferred on  
25 the director or the commission by sections 1 and 2 of this 2015 Act.

26 “SECTION 4. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate  
27 preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is  
28 declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage.”.

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
