- **"SECTION 1.** ORS 31.710 is amended to read:
- 6 "31.710. (1) Except for claims subject to ORS 30.260 to 30.300 and ORS
  - chapter 656, in any civil action seeking damages [arising out of bodily injury,
- 8 including emotional injury or distress, death or property damage] for the
- 9 wrongful death of any one person including claims for loss of care, comfort,
- 10 companionship and society and loss of consortium, the amount awarded for
- noneconomic damages [shall] **may** not exceed [\$500,000] **\$1,500,000**.
- "(2) Beginning in 2020, and every year thereafter, the State Court 12 Administrator shall determine the percentage increase or decrease in 13 the cost of living for the previous calendar year, based on changes in 14 the Portland-Salem, OR-WA Consumer Price Index for All Urban 15 Consumers for All Items as published by the Bureau of Labor Statis-16 tics of the United States Department of Labor. On or before July 1 of 17 the year in which the State Court Administrator makes the determi-18 nation required by this subsection, the State Court Administrator 19 shall adjust the limitation imposed under subsection (1) of this section 20 for the following calendar year by multiplying the limitation amount 21 applicable to the calendar year in which the adjustment is made by the 22

- 1 percentage amount determined under this subsection. The State Court
- 2 Administrator shall round the adjusted limitation amount to the
- nearest \$100, but the unrounded amount shall be used to calculate the
- 4 adjustment to the limitation in subsequent calendar years. The ad-
- 5 justed limitation becomes effective on July 1 of the year in which the
- 6 adjustment is made, and applies to all causes of action arising on or
- 7 after July 1 of that year and before July 1 of the subsequent year.
- 8 "[(2) As used in this section:]
- 9 "[(a) 'Economic damages' means objectively verifiable monetary losses in-
- 10 cluding but not limited to reasonable charges necessarily incurred for medical,
- 11 hospital, nursing and rehabilitative services and other health care services,
- burial and memorial expenses, loss of income and past and future impairment
- of earning capacity, reasonable and necessary expenses incurred for substitute
- 14 domestic services, recurring loss to an estate, damage to reputation that is
- 15 economically verifiable, reasonable and necessarily incurred costs due to loss
- of use of property and reasonable costs incurred for repair or for replacement
- of damaged property, whichever is less.
- "[(b) 'Noneconomic damages' means subjective, nonmonetary losses, includ-
- ing but not limited to pain, mental suffering, emotional distress, humiliation,
- 20 injury to reputation, loss of care, comfort, companionship and society, loss of
- 21 consortium, inconvenience and interference with normal and usual activities
- 22 apart from gainful employment.]
- 23 "(3) This section does not apply to punitive damages.
- "(4) The jury [shall] **may** not be advised of the limitation set forth in this
- 25 section.
- 26 "SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 31.710 by section 1 of this
- 27 2015 Act apply to causes of action that arise on or after the effective
- 28 date of this 2015 Act.".
- In line 6, delete "2" and insert "3".
- Delete lines 22 through 31.

- On page 2, delete lines 1 through 15.
- On page 7, delete lines 28 through 32 and insert:

"SECTION 12. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage."
