

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 891**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after “services” insert a period and
2 delete the rest of the line and delete lines 3 through 15.

3 Delete lines 17 through 28 and delete pages 2 through 4 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1. Sections 2 and 3 of this 2015 Act are added to and**
5 **made a part of the Insurance Code.**

6 **“SECTION 2. An insurer and a third party administrator that uses**
7 **an online tool to provide to enrollees the information required by ORS**
8 **743.874 and 743.876 shall make the tool available to the general public.**

9 **“SECTION 3. (1) As used in this section:**

10 **“(a) ‘Allowed amount’ means the amount paid by an insurer or a**
11 **third party administrator for services covered by a health benefit plan.**

12 **“(b) ‘Health benefit plan’ has the meaning given that term in ORS**
13 **743.730.**

14 **“(2) A health insurer or a third party administrator that offers or**
15 **administers a health benefit plan in this state shall make the following**
16 **information available to insureds and to the general public at the**
17 **insurer’s or administrator’s website:**

18 **“(a) The 50 most common inpatient admissions, procedures or ser-**
19 **vices and the 50 most common outpatient procedures or services paid**
20 **for or reimbursed by the insurer or administrator under the health**
21 **benefit plan;**

22 **“(b) The maximum allowed amount for each admission, procedure**

1 or service identified in paragraph (a) of this subsection; and

2 “(c) The estimated amount that an individual who enrolls in the
3 health benefit plan would be responsible to pay for an admission, pro-
4 cedure or service identified in paragraph (a) of this subsection, in-
5 cluding facility fees, copayments, deductibles, coinsurance or other
6 out-of-pocket expenses incurred by the enrollee.

7 “(3) This section does not prevent an insurer or third party admin-
8 istrator from imposing cost-sharing requirements under the terms of
9 the health benefit plan for additional unforeseen health services that
10 arise during an admission, procedure or service.

11 “SECTION 4. Section 3 of this 2015 Act becomes operative on Jan-
12 uary 1, 2017.”.

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
