## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 891

- On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after "services" insert a period and delete the rest of the line and delete lines 3 through 15.
- Delete lines 17 through 28 and delete pages 2 through 4 and insert:
- "SECTION 1. Sections 2 and 3 of this 2015 Act are added to and made a part of the Insurance Code.
  - "SECTION 2. An insurer and a third party administrator that uses an online tool to provide to enrollees the information required by ORS 743.874 and 743.876 shall make the tool available to the general public.
- 9 "SECTION 3. (1) As used in this section:

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- "(a) 'Allowed amount' means the amount paid by an insurer or a third party administrator for services covered by a health benefit plan.
- 12 "(b) 'Health benefit plan' has the meaning given that term in ORS 13 743.730.
- "(2) A health insurer or a third party administrator that offers or administers a health benefit plan in this state shall make the following information available to insureds and to the general public at the insurer's or administrator's website:
- "(a) The 50 most common inpatient admissions, procedures or services and the 50 most common outpatient procedures or services paid for or reimbursed by the insurer or administrator under the health benefit plan;
  - "(b) The maximum allowed amount for each admission, procedure

or service identified in paragraph (a) of this subsection; and

"(c) The estimated amount that an individual who enrolls in the health benefit plan would be responsible to pay for an admission, procedure or service identified in paragraph (a) of this subsection, including facility fees, copayments, deductibles, coinsurance or other out-of-pocket expenses incurred by the enrollee.

"(3) This section does not prevent an insurer or third party administrator from imposing cost-sharing requirements under the terms of the health benefit plan for additional unforeseen health services that arise during an admission, procedure or service.

"SECTION 4. Section 3 of this 2015 Act becomes operative on January 1, 2017.".

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
