In line 2 of the printed bill, after "drugs" insert "; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 743A.066".

3 After line 12, insert:

4 "SECTION 3. ORS 743A.066 is amended to read:

"743A.066. (1) As used in this section, 'prescription contraceptive'
means a drug or device that requires a prescription and is approved
by the United States Food and Drug Administration to prevent pregnancy.

9 "[(1)] (2) A prescription drug benefit program, or a prescription drug 10 benefit offered under a health benefit plan as defined in ORS 743.730 or un-11 der a student health insurance policy, must provide payment, coverage or 12 reimbursement for:

13 "(a) Prescription contraceptives; and

"(b) If covered for other drug benefits under the program, plan or policy, outpatient consultations, examinations, procedures and medical services that are necessary to prescribe, dispense, deliver, distribute, administer or remove a prescription contraceptive.

18 "(2)] (3) The coverage required by subsection [(1)] (2) of this section:

"(a) May be subject to provisions of the program, plan or policy that apply equally to other prescription drugs covered by the program, plan or policy, including but not limited to required copayments, deductibles and coinsurance[.]; and "(b) Must reimburse a health care provider or dispensing entity for
dispensing a prescription contraceptive drug for:

"(A) Up to a three-month supply for the first dispensing of the
prescription contraceptive drug to an insured;

5 "(B) Up to a three-month supply for the second dispensing of the
6 prescription contraceptive drug to an insured; and

"(C) Up to a six-month supply for subsequent dispensings of the
prescription contraceptive drug to an insured, regardless of whether
the insured was enrolled in the program, plan or policy at the time
of the first dispensing.

"[(3) As used in this section, 'contraceptive' means a drug or device approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration to prevent pregnancy.]

"(4) A religious employer is exempt from the requirements of this section
with respect to a prescription drug benefit program or a health benefit plan
it provides to its employees. A 'religious employer' is an employer:

17 "(a) Whose purpose is the inculcation of religious values;

"(b) That primarily employs persons who share the religious tenets of theemployer;

20 "(c) That primarily serves persons who share the religious tenets of the 21 employer; and

"(d) That is a nonprofit organization under section 6033(a)(2)(A)(i) or (iii)
of the Internal Revenue Code.
