"SECTION 1. (1) For the purposes of this section, 'plan student' means a student enrolled in kindergarten through grade 12 who is African-American or a member of a student group that has experienced disproportionate outcomes in education due to historical practices, as identified by the State Board of Education by rule.

"(2) The Department of Education shall develop and implement a
 statewide education plan for plan students. The plan shall be devel oped:

"(a) In consultation with the Youth Development Division, the
 Early Learning Division and the Higher Education Coordinating Com mission; and

"(a) The disparities experienced by plan students in every indicator
of academic success, as documented by the department's statewide
report card;

"(b) Increase plan student attendance in four-year post-secondary
 institutions of education.

"(6) The department shall submit a biennial report concerning the progress of the plan developed and implemented under this section at each even-numbered year regular session of the Legislative Assembly in the manner provided by ORS 192.245 to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to education.
