

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO  
HOUSE BILL 2224**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after the first semicolon delete the  
2 rest of the line and delete lines 3 through 7 and insert “amending ORS  
3 124.050; and”.

4 Delete lines 10 through 28 and delete pages 2 through 34 and insert:

5 **“SECTION 1. ORS 124.050, as amended by section 5, chapter 352, Oregon  
6 Laws 2013, and section 9, chapter 104, Oregon Laws 2014, is amended to read:**

7 “124.050. As used in ORS 124.050 to 124.095:

8 “(1) ‘Abuse’ means one or more of the following:

9 “(a) Any physical injury to an elderly person caused by other than acci-  
10 dental means, or which appears to be at variance with the explanation given  
11 of the injury.

12 “(b) Neglect.

13 “(c) Abandonment, including desertion or willful forsaking of an elderly  
14 person or the withdrawal or neglect of duties and obligations owed an el-  
15 derly person by a caretaker or other person.

16 “(d) Willful infliction of physical pain or injury upon an elderly person.

17 “(e) An act that constitutes a crime under ORS 163.375, 163.405, 163.411,  
18 163.415, 163.425, 163.427, 163.465, 163.467 or 163.525.

19 “(f) Verbal abuse.

20 “(g) Financial exploitation.

21 “(h) Sexual abuse.

22 “(i) Involuntary seclusion of an elderly person for the convenience of a

1 caregiver or to discipline the person.

2 “(j) A wrongful use of a physical or chemical restraint of an elderly per-  
3 son, excluding an act of restraint prescribed by a physician licensed under  
4 ORS chapter 677 and any treatment activities that are consistent with an  
5 approved treatment plan or in connection with a court order.

6 “(2) ‘Elderly person’ means any person 65 years of age or older who is not  
7 subject to the provisions of ORS 441.640 to 441.665.

8 “(3) ‘Facility’ means:

9 “(a) A long term care facility as that term is defined in ORS 442.015.

10 “(b) A residential facility as that term is defined in ORS 443.400, includ-  
11 ing but not limited to an assisted living facility.

12 “(c) An adult foster home as that term is defined in ORS 443.705.

13 “(4) ‘Financial exploitation’ means:

14 “(a) Wrongfully taking the assets, funds or property belonging to or in-  
15 tended for the use of an elderly person or a person with a disability.

16 “(b) Alarming an elderly person or a person with a disability by convey-  
17 ing a threat to wrongfully take or appropriate money or property of the  
18 person if the person would reasonably believe that the threat conveyed would  
19 be carried out.

20 “(c) Misappropriating, misusing or transferring without authorization any  
21 money from any account held jointly or singly by an elderly person or a  
22 person with a disability.

23 “(d) Failing to use the income or assets of an elderly person or a person  
24 with a disability effectively for the support and maintenance of the person.

25 “(5) ‘Intimidation’ means compelling or deterring conduct by threat.

26 “(6) ‘Law enforcement agency’ means:

27 “(a) Any city or municipal police department.

28 “(b) Any county sheriff’s office.

29 “(c) The Oregon State Police.

30 “(d) Any district attorney.

1 “(e) A police department established by a university under ORS 352.383  
2 or 353.125.

3 “(7) ‘Neglect’ means failure to provide basic care or services that are  
4 necessary to maintain the health or safety of an elderly person.

5 “(8) ‘Person with a disability’ means a person described in:

6 “(a) ORS 410.040 (7); or

7 “(b) ORS 410.715.

8 “(9) ‘Public or private official’ means:

9 “(a) Physician or physician assistant licensed under ORS chapter 677,  
10 naturopathic physician or chiropractor, including any intern or resident.

11 “(b) Licensed practical nurse, registered nurse, nurse practitioner, nurse’s  
12 aide, home health aide or employee of an in-home health service.

13 “(c) Employee of the Department of Human Services or community de-  
14 velopmental disabilities program.

15 “(d) Employee of the Oregon Health Authority, county health department  
16 or community mental health program.

17 “(e) Peace officer.

18 “(f) Member of the clergy.

19 “(g) Regulated social worker.

20 “(h) Physical, speech or occupational therapist.

21 “(i) Senior center employee.

22 “(j) Information and referral or outreach worker.

23 “(k) Licensed professional counselor or licensed marriage and family  
24 therapist.

25 “(L) Member of the Legislative Assembly.

26 “(m) Firefighter or emergency medical services provider.

27 “(n) Psychologist.

28 “(o) Provider of adult foster care or an employee of the provider.

29 “(p) Audiologist.

30 “(q) Speech-language pathologist.

1 “(r) Attorney.

2 “(s) Dentist.

3 “(t) Optometrist.

4 “(u) Chiropractor.

5 “(10) ‘Services’ includes but is not limited to the provision of food,  
6 clothing, medicine, housing, medical services, assistance with bathing or  
7 personal hygiene or any other service essential to the well-being of an el-  
8 derly person.

9 “(11)(a) ‘Sexual abuse’ means:

10 “(A) Sexual contact with an elderly person who does not consent or is  
11 considered incapable of consenting to a sexual act under ORS 163.315;

12 “(B) Verbal or physical harassment of a sexual nature, including but not  
13 limited to severe or pervasive exposure to sexually explicit material or lan-  
14 guage;

15 “(C) Sexual exploitation;

16 “(D) Any sexual contact between an employee of a facility or paid  
17 caregiver and an elderly person served by the facility or caregiver; or

18 “(E) Any sexual contact that is achieved through force, trickery, threat  
19 or coercion.

20 “(b) ‘Sexual abuse’ does not mean consensual sexual contact between an  
21 elderly person and a paid caregiver.

22 “(12) ‘Sexual contact’ has the meaning given that term in ORS 163.305.

23 “(13) ‘Verbal abuse’ means to threaten significant physical or emotional  
24 harm to an elderly person or a person with a disability through the use of:

25 “(a) Derogatory or inappropriate names, insults, verbal assaults, profanity  
26 or ridicule; or

27 “(b) Harassment, coercion, threats, intimidation, humiliation, mental cru-  
28 elty or inappropriate sexual comments.

29 “(14) **‘Wrongfully’ means carried out through deceit, trickery,**  
30 **subterfuge, coercion, harassment, duress, fraud or undue influence.**

1       **“SECTION 2. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate**  
2 **preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is**  
3 **declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage.”.**
