

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO  
HOUSE BILL 3225**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 3, after “materials” delete the rest of  
2 the line and delete lines 3 and 4 and insert a period.

3 Delete lines 6 through 22 and delete pages 2 through 12 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1. (1) As part of the plan for the effective implementa-**  
5 **tion of a statewide hazardous material emergency response system**  
6 **adopted by rule under ORS 453.374, the State Fire Marshal shall adopt**  
7 **by rule a plan for the coordinated response to oil or hazardous mate-**  
8 **rial spills or releases that occur during rail transport. The plan**  
9 **adopted under this subsection shall include, but need not be limited**  
10 **to:**

11 **“(a) All provisions required under ORS 453.374 with a specific focus**  
12 **on oil or hazardous material spills or releases that occur during rail**  
13 **transport; and**

14 **“(b) Requirements and incentives for local governments and other**  
15 **responders to participate in ongoing training programs.**

16 **“(2) Not later than February 1 of each odd-numbered year, the of-**  
17 **fice of the State Fire Marshal shall submit a report to the Legislative**  
18 **Assembly in the manner provided in ORS 192.245 on the efficacy of the**  
19 **coordinated response plan required under this section. The office shall**  
20 **coordinate with local governments, other state agencies involved in**  
21 **hazardous material emergency response, other responders and repre-**  
22 **sentatives of the railroad industry in completing the report. The report**

1 shall include, but need not be limited to, discussion of the following  
2 issues related to hazardous material emergency response for rail  
3 transport:

4 “(a) Suggested changes to the structure for the continued coordi-  
5 nation between state agencies and industry;

6 “(b) Possible revisions to the response roles or responsibilities of  
7 state agencies, local governments and railroads;

8 “(c) An inventory of the resources available statewide and addi-  
9 tional resources that are needed to provide for adequate response; and

10 “(d) Strategies for ensuring adequate funding at the state and local  
11 government level for comprehensive response and equipment.”.

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
