

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 2818**

1 On page 2 of the printed bill, after line 11, insert:

2 **“SECTION 3. (1) The Task Force on Charitable Checkoffs is estab-**
3 **lished, consisting of five members appointed as follows:**

4 **“(a) The President of the Senate shall appoint two members from**
5 **among members of the Senate.**

6 **“(b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint**
7 **three members from among members of the House of Representatives.**

8 **“(2) The task force shall investigate the functioning of the charita-**
9 **ble checkoff system and what steps may be taken to improve func-**
10 **tioning of the charitable checkoff system.**

11 **“(3) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a**
12 **quorum for the transaction of business.**

13 **“(4) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a**
14 **majority of the members of the task force.**

15 **“(5) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as**
16 **chairperson.**

17 **“(6) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority**
18 **shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.**

19 **“(7) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the**
20 **call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the task**
21 **force.**

22 **“(8) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of**

1 the task force.

2 “(9) The Oregon Charitable Checkoff Commission shall provide staff
3 support to the task force.

4 “(10) The task force may pre-session file legislation in the manner
5 provided in ORS 171.130 for interim committees. All legislation re-
6 commended by official action of the task force must indicate that it
7 is introduced at the request of the task force.

8 “(11) The task force shall report to the Legislative Assembly in the
9 manner provided in ORS 192.245 at any time within 30 days after its
10 final meeting or at such later time as the President and Speaker may
11 designate.

12 “(12) The Legislative Administrator may employ persons necessary
13 for the performance of the functions of the task force. The Legislative
14 Administrator shall fix the duties and amounts of compensation of
15 these employees. The task force shall use the services of continuing
16 legislative staff, without employing additional persons, to the greatest
17 extent practicable.

18 “(13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111,
19 are directed to assist the task force in the performance of its duties
20 and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to
21 furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force
22 consider necessary to perform their duties.

23 “SECTION 4. Section 3 of this 2015 Act is repealed on December 31,
24 2015.”.

25 In line 12, delete “3” and insert “5”.

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
