

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 3382**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after the first semicolon delete the
2 rest of the line and line 3 and insert “amending section 4, chapter 724,
3 Oregon Laws 2013; and repealing section 3, chapter 724, Oregon Laws
4 2013.”.

5 Delete lines 5 through 27 and delete page 2 and insert:

6 **“SECTION 1.** Section 4, chapter 724, Oregon Laws 2013, is amended to
7 read:

8 **“Sec. 4.** (1) As used in this section, ‘Willamette Valley Protected
9 District’ has the meaning given that term in section 1, **chapter 724, Oregon**
10 **Laws 2013** [*of this 2013 Act*].

11 “(2) Subject to the Willamette Valley Protected District production cap
12 established in section 1 (2), **chapter 724, Oregon Laws 2013** [*of this 2013*
13 *Act*], the State Department of Agriculture may authorize the growing of
14 canola to allow the College of Agricultural Sciences of Oregon State Uni-
15 versity to carry out the research duties of the college under this section. Any
16 authorization for the growing of canola under this section must be limited
17 to canola crop production cycles that are completed prior to January 1,
18 [2017] **2020**.

19 “(3) Canola may be grown for purposes of research under this section only
20 if the isolation distance between the canola and other crops equals or ex-
21 ceeds the industry-recommended isolation distance between Brassica spe-
22 cialty seed crops and other crops.

1 “(4)(a) The college shall use field monitoring and other research to de-
2 velop information and recommendations regarding whether, and under what
3 conditions, canola growing in the Willamette Valley Protected District is
4 compatible with the growing of other crops. The information must include,
5 but not be limited to, a comparison of the compatibility of canola with the
6 growing of other crops to the compatibility of other Brassica seed with the
7 growing of other crops. **The college shall submit the information for
8 review by experts having sufficient knowledge of vegetable seed pro-
9 duction to provide a thorough and proper evaluation of the quality,
10 significance and originality of the research.** The assessment shall in-
11 clude, but not be limited to, a review of available published materials and
12 historical data on canola and Brassica specialty seed production **from
13 northern France and from England and a review of how western
14 Washington, western Idaho and central and eastern Oregon manage
15 canola for seed production.**

16 “(b) In addition to any other required content, the information and rec-
17 ommendations described in paragraph (a) of this subsection must include, but
18 not be limited to, a map of the Willamette Valley Protected District showing
19 the places within the district where plants of the genus Brassica could be
20 grown while maintaining typical isolation distances from vegetables, vege-
21 table seeds and other crops.

22 “(5) All research described in subsection (4) of this section must be peer
23 reviewed.

24 “(6) The college shall [*complete its research under this section and*] submit
25 a report containing **preliminary study** information and recommendations
26 as described in subsection (4) of this section to an interim committee of the
27 Legislative Assembly dealing with agriculture no later than November 1,
28 2017.

29 **“SECTION 2. Section 3, chapter 724, Oregon Laws 2013, is
30 repealed.”**
