WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Establishes tiered system for minimum wage based on geographic location and employer size. Establishes Wage Enforcement Fund. Creates Minimum Wage Advisory Committee. Repeals state preemption of local authority to set minimum wage requirements. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:

Proposed -1: Replaces original measure. Raises minimum wage to \$13.25 by July 1, 2022. Establishes higher wage for employees working in the Portland metropolitan area (Clackamas, Multnomah and Washington Counties). Adjusts statewide rate annually for inflation after June 30, 2023, with the Portland rate set \$1.25 higher. Maintains state preemption of local authority to set minimum wage requirement. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Proposed -2: Replaces original measure. Raises minimum wage to \$13.50 by January 1, 2022. Establishes higher wage for employees working in Portland metropolitan area (Clackamas, Multnomah and Washington Counties). Adjusts statewide and Portland rates annually for inflation starting January 2023. Maintains state preemption of local authority to set minimum wage requirement. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

BACKGROUND: The minimum wage is the lowest hourly wage a non-exempt employee may be paid by an employer. In 1938, Congress set the first national minimum wage at 25 cents an hour. Currently, the federal minimum wage is \$7.25 an hour. In 2002, Oregon voters enacted Measure 25, setting the Oregon minimum wage at \$6.90 an hour and directing the Bureau of Labor and Industries to annually adjust the Oregon minimum wage for inflation, as determined by the annual change in the U.S. City Average Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers for All Items. Currently, Oregon's minimum wage is \$9.25 an hour; it did not increase in 2016.

The following table illustrates the number of jobs in various wage categories. Data is for Q1 2014 from the Oregon Employment Department. Note that the minimum wage in 2014 was \$9.10 per hour.
