Chair Gelser and Members of the Committee:

I strongly disagree with SB1575 and urge you to not support it.

SB1575 wastes productive resource land which will be of increasing importance as populations grow and demand for food and fiber increases. Taken together, the provisions of the bill add up to giving cities carte blanche to expand into farm and forest land without restraint and without regard for existing state laws designed to provide orderly and efficient growth.
