On behalf of our over 40,000 members and supporters across the state, **Environment Oregon supports HB 4037 as one of the key steps Oregon should take toward repowering our state with clean**, **renewable, solar energy**. Environment Oregon is a statewide, citizen-based, environmental advocacy organization.

As we experience the effects of global warming, from extreme drought to decreased snowpack, Oregon must shift away from fossil fuels that contribute to global warming and instead repower our state with clean, renewable energy. **HB 4037** is forward-thinking and balanced, and it functions as a simple and effective tool to get on the right track with solar power. Oregon lags woefully behind its solar energy potential, with only 0.02% of our current electricity consumption coming from the sun<sup>1</sup>.

And as our members make decisions about their own energy usage, time and again it becomes apparent that Oregonians are ready to make the shift toward renewables. The result of this legislation could be hundreds of megawatts of solar power being generated in Oregon and distributed to the tens of thousands of Oregonians who want locally-sourced, carbon-free energy.
