The People Mover receives federal funding sources directly through Oregon ODOT. Additional funds come from passenger fares (which cannot be used a match) and contract revenue.

Like many other transit agencies GCTD has no designated source of local match

for transit operations. All local match comes from contract revenue and STF funds.

Ridership has increased and continues in that trend. Our Demand Response system is at or exceeds capacity most of the time.


If the Highly Rural Transportation Grant through the VA is not renewed annually, it could mean cutting the Walla Walla and Burns Intercity Routes as no other funding source for these routes have been identified.
