

CURRY PUBLIC TRANSIT FUNDING

- Curry Public Transit currently uses all local and state funding to match federal grants.
 CPTI also uses past BETC funds to make up match deficits. No federal or state grant money has been left on the table for several years because of CPTI's ability to use "saved" match. However, this fund is being depleted.
- Due to inflation CPTI will only be able to sustain present level of service for a few more years. Since the formation of Community Care Organizations in October 2014, CPTI has lost 80% of Contracted Medical Income. Currently payroll and related expenses account for 58% of all expenses, maintanence and fuel for 27%, and general supplies, rent, and utilities for 15%. The anticipated increase in minimum wage, new mandatory medical leave costs, and increased maintanence for an aging fleet will increase these costs.
- If the State of Oregon would match the Federal 5311 funds currently at 43.92% down to 10.27%, CPTI would be able to make up the deficit from losing non-emergency medical transportation income and maintain current services without spending reserve money.
