



How to Register to Vote in Oregon



Every Oregonian who is at least **17 years old**, a **U.S. Citizen**, and an **Oregon resident** can register to vote. If you are not already registered, we hope you will take advantage of your right to register to vote!

Three ways to register to vote in Oregon:



Automatic Voter Registration – Oregon Motor Voter

The Secretary of State, DMV, and county clerks have partnered to provide you with automatic voter registration in Oregon. Automatic voter registration is available if you are eligible to register to vote and you recently applied for your original, renewal, or replacement license or ID card at the DMV.

You do not need to take any additional action. You will be contacted by mail giving you the opportunity to sign up with a political party or “opt out” of voter registration.

If you choose not to respond by the deadline in the mailing, you will automatically be registered as a nonaffiliated voter (not a member of a political party).

Online Voter Registration

You can register to vote online at oregonvotes.gov/myvote.



Paper Registration

A paper voter registration card is inside. You can fill it out and deliver it to DMV today.

Voter Registration Deadline



To vote in an Oregon election you must be registered to vote 21 days before that election. To register today, please visit oregonvotes.gov/myvote or fill out the included paper form.

information disclosure

Information submitted on an Oregon Voter Registration Card is public record. However, information submitted in the Oregon Driver's License section is, by law, held confidential.

assistance

If you have any questions or need accommodations, please contact the Oregon Elections Division.

If you are 17, you will not receive a ballot until an election occurs on or after your 18th birthday.



The deadline to register to vote is the 21st day before an election

Only registered voters are eligible to sign petitions

You must provide your valid Oregon Driver's License, Permit or ID number.

A suspended Driver's License is valid, a revoked Driver's License is not valid.

-or-

If you do not have valid Oregon ID, provide the last four digits of your Social Security number.

-or-

If you do not have a Social Security number or valid Oregon identification, provide a copy of one of the following that shows your name and current address:

acceptable identification:

- valid photo identification
- a paycheck stub
- a utility bill
- a bank statement
- a government document
- proof of eligibility under the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA) or the Voting Accessibility for the Elderly and Handicapped Act (VAEH)

Exceptions to Automatic Voter Registration

Automatic Voter Registration will **not** be initiated for:

- Participants in the Oregon Department of Justice Address Confidentiality Program (for more information, go to doj.state.or.us/acp)
- Individuals or their family members who have received a personal safety exemption from DMV
- Law enforcement officials who obtain license, permit, or ID cards pursuant to OAR 735-062-0290
- Public employees or their family members who do not submit a residence address to DMV pursuant to ORS 802.250
- Anyone categorized by DMV as a “continuous traveler”
- Individuals who do not provide an electronic signature to DMV

Privacy Concerns

The residence address of a registered voter is a public record. If that is a personal safety concern, before registering to vote you should consider applying for Oregon’s Address Confidentiality Program (ACP) at doj.state.or.us/acp or applying to your County Clerk for a Personal Safety Exemption.

Automatic Address Updates

If you are already registered to vote in Oregon, the information you provide to DMV, including your residence address, may be used to update your voter registration. You can also update your registration at oregonvotes.gov/myvote or by filling out the included card.

Note: *If you register to vote, the DMV office at which you submit a voter registration application will remain confidential and only be used for voter registration purposes. If you decline to register to vote, the fact that you declined will remain confidential and will only be used for voter registration purposes.*
