My name is Jacob Spilker and I am currently a Certified Anesthesiologist Assistant (CAA) at Children's Hospital of Colorado. The reason I am writing you today in support of HB 4108, is because I would like to live and work in Oregon, but I am not able to since CAA's are not licensed in Oregon.

I fulfilled a pre-medical curriculum for a bachelor's degree, took the GRE, and finished a masters program in anesthesia at NOVA Southeastern University of Fort Lauderdale. Now I have been working at the Children's Hospital of Colorado for three years as a CAA. CAAs practice within a anesthesia care team model, which ensures an anesthesiologist is present during the care of every patient. This model reduces patient risk and overall provides a better outcome for the patient. When working in one of the top five pediatric hospitals in the nation, I'm 100% positive the anesthesia care team model is the best practice to provide for these children and being a parent of four children myself, I would want my child being taken care of using this model.

There is a shortage of anesthesia providers in the nation and CRNAs and CAAs fill the same roles within the anesthesia care team.

Here are a few facts of CAAs:

- 1. CAAs are highly skilled health professionals who work under the direction of licensed anesthesiologists to implement anesthesia care plans.
- 2. Before entering an AA training program, a student must complete a bachelor's degree with prerequisites typical of pre-med coursework.
- 3. AA master's-level students train for 24 to 28 months in anesthesiology departments of university medical schools that have anesthesiology residency programs.
- 4. CAA training averages over 600 hours of classroom/laboratory education, 2,600 hours of clinical anesthesia education, and more than 600 anesthetics administered for all types of surgery.
