

SB 941, Oregon Firearms safety act:

Current law already requires the transfer of private-party firearms through a licensed firearm dealer with both parties present.

And a background check on the transferee shall comply with all requirements of federal law!

Under ORS 426.133, mental health disqualification, prohibits a person from purchasing or possessing a firearm if there is reasonable likelihood the person would constitute a danger to self or others or to the community as a result of the person's mental or psychological state demonstrated by either past behavior or involvement in unlawful violence or threats of violence or by reason of a single incident of extreme, violent, unlawful conduct.

HB 4147 would prohibit a sale if the Oregon State Police (OSP) are *unable to determine whether the recipient is prohibited from possessing a firearm*. This deferral from OSP does not necessarily mean the recipient is prohibited, but *rather that OSP is not satisfied with the background check inquiry* and a determination has not yet been made.

Keep politics out of our second amendment, the right to own firearms!
