Dear Chair Clem and Members of the Rural Communities, Land Use and Water Committee:

Thank you very much for the opportunity to testify on HB 4079 on behalf of Oregon Opportunity Network (Oregon ON). We are a statewide association of affordable housing and community development nonprofits, housing authorities, and community action agencies that provide housing and economic opportunity for working families, people with disabilities, seniors and others struggling to meet their needs in communities throughout Oregon.

As members of the Housing Alliance, Oregon ON along with many partners is working hard for a comprehensive and urgent housing agenda this session. As you know, Oregon is facing a crisis of housing access and affordability that is impacting people in communities of all sizes, both rural and urban.

With over 20,000 schoolchildren experiencing homelessness in our state, the stakes have never been higher. We need to move on multiple fronts with great urgency and creativity to keep families stably housed. Only with a stable home comes the best opportunity for health, success in school and work, and prosperity.

In response to this crisis, HB 4079 provides a thoughtful and creative pilot-project approach that we believe is worth exploring.

We appreciate that this bill recognizes the special values of some lands, focuses on non-metro area cities where the adjacency of services and infrastructure is more proximate, calls out the need for the housing to be located near infrastructure, and has important provisions calling both for adjustment to market variance and for long-term affordability.

As this concept moves forward, we would welcome the opportunity to be engaged around additional key details to be determined through rule-making, such as levels of affordability, and what ratio of affordable housing to other uses might be required or expected.

In the meantime, we are excited to see creative ideas like this one, to increase access to affordable housing opportunities in new and innovative ways.

Thank you very much for the opportunity to weigh in, and for your service to Oregon.
