WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Includes agreeing to receive goods, services, or something else of value derived from prostitution activity in crime of promoting prostitution.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: Under current law, a person commits the crime of promoting prostitution if a person knowingly owns or maintains a place of prostitution; induces or causes a person to engage in prostitution or remain in a place of prostitution; or receives or agrees to receive money or property derived from prostitution, other than compensation to the prostitute. Promoting prostitution is a Class C felony. ORS 167.012.

House Bill 4082 adds new language to the description of the crime of promoting prostitution to include receiving or agreeing to receive goods, services, or something else of value that is derived from prostitution.
