Dear Chair Williamson and members of the House Rules Committee:

I write on behalf of Oregon Opportunity Network (Oregon ON), the statewide association of affordable housing and community development nonprofits, in support of HB 4143.

Working to provide housing and services in communities across Oregon, our members see people in crisis everyday—people living in cars and on the street, people one paycheck from homelessness, people working full-time but still struggling to pay the rent. This has been a growing problem across Oregon, but in the past couple of years we've hit the perfect storm. With populations growing and the market not building new units during the Recession, vacancies are at all-time lows and rent increases are at all-time highs.

We know that a stable, safe place to call home is the key to success. We know the policy and resource strategies that can put us back on track to meeting the housing needs of the most vulnerable Oregonians. Enacting reasonable tenant protections is an important part of the solution – along with lifting the statewide ban on Inclusionary Housing (SB 1533).

Many Oregon ON members, as operators of affordable housing, are landlords; and our housing authority members work closely with private landlords who rent to folks with Section 8 vouchers. So we understand first-hand the significant challenges of being a landlord, and the need for a balanced approach that protects the rights of all parties. We strongly believe that tenants need greater protections from the current market, and that the seriousness of the crisis in communities across Oregon warrants immediate action in this short session.

We urge you to support the reasonable tenant protections included in HB 4143. As amended, it is far less than we had initially hoped for, but still a very important step in the right direction.
