Instructional Time Standards

(1) Minimum Required Hours:

| Grade | Old Standard | New Standard | Increase |
|-------------|--------------|--------------|----------|
| Half-Day K | 405 hours | 450 hours | 45 hours |
| Full-Day K | n/a | 900 hours | n/a |
| Grades 1-3 | 810 hours | 900 hours | 90 hours |
| Grades 4-8 | 900 hours | 900 hours | n/a |
| Grades 9-11 | 990 hours | 900 hours | n/a |
| Grade 12 | 990 hours | 966 hours | n/a |

Districts may count up to 60 hours of recess as instructional time for full-day kindergarten and grades 1-3; 30 hours for half-day kindergarten

Instructional Time Standards

(2) Percentage of students scheduled:

| Year | Requirement |
|---------|---|
| 2015-16 | 80% of students in the district must be scheduled to receive annually the minimum hours of instructional time |
| 2016-17 | 85% of students in the district must be scheduled to receive annually the minimum hours of instructional time |
| 2017-18 | 90% of students in the district must be scheduled to receive annually the minimum hours of instructional time |
| 2018-19 | 92% of students in the district and 80% of all students at each school operated by the district must be scheduled to receive annually the minimum hours of instructional time |


Instructional Time Standards

- (3) Definition of "instructional time"
 - Capped parent teacher conferences at 30 hours
 - Phasing out allowance for emergency school closures due to inclement weather and facilities failures
- (4) Online instruction
- (5) Eliminated 130 hours per credit requirement

Survey Results: Full-Day Kindergarten

Question: How many hours of instructional time did the district add in order to provide 900 hours for full-day kindergarten?


- 141 districts responded
- 93 districts (66%) did not increase instructional time
- 40 districts (28%) implemented fullday kindergarten
- 9 districts (6%) increased instructional time to meet the new instructional time requirements



Survey Results: Grades 1-3

Question: How many hours of instructional time did the district add in order to provide 900 hours for grades 1-3?

- 141 districts responded
- 128 districts (91%) did not have to increase instructional time
- 13 districts (9%) did increase instructional time to meet new requirements




Did not increase time

Survey Results: K-3 Financial Impact

Question: What was the financial impact on your district in 2015-16 resulting from the increase in instructional time for kindergarten and grades 1-3?

- 140 districts responded
- 128 districts (91%) reported no financial impact as a result of the increased instructional time requirement K-3
- 12 districts (9%) reported some financial impact



Survey Results: 2015-16 Benchmark

| Year | Requirement |
|---------|---|
| 2015-16 | 80% of students in the district must be scheduled to receive annually the minimum hours of instructional time |

Question: For the 2015-16 school year, what percentage of students in your district are scheduled to receive the minimum hours of instructional time.

- 113 districts responded
- 113 districts (100%) are currently meeting the 2015-16 benchmark

2014-15 Division 22 Assurances

| Year | Requirement | Number of districts not meeting requirement |
|---------|---|---|
| 2015-16 | 80% of students in the district must be scheduled to receive annually the minimum hours of instructional time | 1 |
| 2016-17 | 85% of students in the district must be scheduled to receive annually the minimum hours of instructional time | 2 |
| 2017-18 | 90% of students in the district must be scheduled to receive annually the minimum hours of instructional time | 4 |
| 2018-19 | 92% of students in the district and 80% of all students at each school operated by the district must be scheduled to receive annually the minimum hours of instructional time | |

Survey Results: 2015-16 Benchmark

| Year | Requirement |


Question: What was the financial impact on your district in meeting

the 2015-16 benchmark?

120 districts responded

101 districts (84%) reported no financial impact

• 19 districts (16%) reported some financial impact



Survey Results: 2018-19 Benchmark

| Year | Requirement |
|---------|---|
| 2018-19 | 92% of students in the district and 80% of all students at each |
| | school operated by the district must be scheduled to receive |
| | annually the minimum hours of instructional time |

Question: What is the anticipated financial impact on your district in

meeting the 2018-19 benchmark?

- 119 districts responded
- 91 districts (76%) anticipate no additional financial impact
- 2 districts (2%) are uncertain
- 26 districts (22%) anticipate some financial impact if budget remains at current service level



Survey Results: Collective Bargaining

Question: In order to meet the new instructional time requirements, has your district had to enter into collective bargaining or negotiations with your employees to adjust contracts?

- 115 districts responded to the question
- 15 districts anticipate some issues will need to be addressed through collective bargaining
- 3 districts have already entered into bargaining:
 - With the licensed group to decrease professional development in order to pay for 2 student contact days
 - Because student contact is a mandatory bargaining issue
 - Negotiated to increase contact time for 3 primary teachers
