This bill is a retreat from good land use policy and also evidence of pandering to the developer and real estate lobby which has set its sights on eviscerating the urban/rural reserves system. It is also part of a larger pattern in evidence of legislative leadership being in retreat on what promised to be a productive session on affordable housing issues from Inclusionary Zoning (IZ) to renter protections.
