

## House Bill 4019A Senate Education Committee February 22, 2016

Chair Roblan, Vice Chair Knopp and members of the committee. For the record, my name is Dana Richardson, Deputy Director for the Higher Education Coordinating Commission.

I am here today to speak to House Bill 4019A. This is a clean-up bill for a few higher education statutes.

In this bill, the HECC is seeking to clarify that:

- (Section 1) References in Oregon Student Access & Completion (OSAC) statutes are to the OSAC Executive Director and not the HECC Executive Director;
- (Section 2) Statutes dealing with diploma mills do not include community colleges, public universities or OHSU, by definition;
- (Section 3) Certain schools have to operate in Oregon for 10 years, rather than 5, to be exempt from HECC oversight; and
- (Section 9) Certain exempt religious institutions report to the HECC rather than OSAC.

Section 7 of the bill also adds dependents of veterans or people who left Oregon to serve in the Peace Corps to those who can return to Oregon and get in-state tuition. Dependents were left out of a bill that established these benefits last Session (House Bill 2670 (2015).

Section 8 makes an additional change to Individual Development Accounts that I will defer the description of to Neighborhood Partnerships who are seeking the technical change.

In short, this is a technical fix bill and I hope I have explained it to your satisfaction. Thank you for your attention and I would be happy to answer any questions.
