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The Oregon Talent Council was established by the legislature in 2015 (House Bill 2728) to advise and be a resource on issues of talent development and to promote the growth and competitiveness of Oregon's traded sector and high-growth industries.

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The issue is clear: Oregon's economy depends on talented employees with the right combination of education, applied skills and experience who can be productive workers contributing to the growth and vitality of companies large and small.

Today's workers are more mobile. Ever-changing technology and advancing knowledge, along with instant data and virtual connections, are changing the way we think about talent.

- High growth industries need employees who can continuously learn new skills and quickly adapt.
- How we deliver education and training must be agile; classroom learning alone is not enough. On-demand education and training in more frequent, bite-size nuggets is needed to keep skills fresh and competitive.

Our Role

The Oregon Talent Council provides a voice and focus for these issues, serving as a bridge to connect the talent demand from industry with the supply of talent provided by various education and workforce partners. To meet these objectives, the Council supports efforts that result in:

- Graduates of programs with strong, employable skills and experience.
- Opportunities for incumbent workers to have greater access to cost-effective, on-demand training.
- Easier employer access to the qualified talent required by industries for core operations and growth.

The Council plays three strategic roles in supporting talent objectives:

Unite industry, education, workforce and government around a shared set of talent data and priorities.

Catalyze with co-investments that increase workers' skills and employability to enhance company competitiveness.

BRIDGE AND ALIGN SUPPLY & DEMAND

Transform the way we connect and provide resources that support key talent needs throughout Oregon.

With a mission of ***making Oregonians the first and best choice of Oregon employers***, the Talent Council is focused on professional and technical occupations that are mission critical or pivotal to the high growth industries identified in the Oregon Talent Plan. - **Oregon enhances its reputation** as a state for high quality talent that supports the growth and attraction of businesses.
