COMPENSATION AND PENSION




185% INCREASE SINCE 2003 (+\$845 M)

- \$106 million per month in Compensation and Pension payments was received by Oregon veterans (2014)
- More than 67,000 veterans received Compensation and Pension payments (2014)
- \$19,127 is the annual average of Compensation and Pension payments received by veterans (2014)



EDUCATION




349% INCREASE SINCE 2003 (+\$110.4 M)

These dollars flow directly into the state's **community college and university system**, and provide monthly income to veterans while attending school.



155% INCREASE SINCE 2003 (+\$608 M)

Currently one third of Oregon veterans have access to VA healthcare. More than \$1 billion was spent in Oregon providing that care in 2014, an increase of nearly 12% over 2014. VA's health care benefit meets mandatory health insurance coverage requirements.
