My name is Kelly, I am 47 years old, and I am a single mom to two daughters – 21 and 7. I have a Bachelors, but I have had to settle for fast food work because it gives me flexible hours so that I can be a good parent.

My family has Oregon Health Plan, and I get a day care subsidy for my daughter. As a tribal member, I also receive \$130 a month in assistance. I rely on all of these to make ends meet every month.

If I got a raise, I would love to buy a home. But right now, I feel very hopeless and doubt that will ever happen. I would also prioritize getting dental care, buying a reliable car, shoes for my child, and emergency savings. I would also love to have internet service.
